Marianne Vika:

Today there are six from the Oslo police, who will testify about the extensive investigation of 22 July attacks.

* Following is the Nissen police superintendent Dag Uppheim from the Police Security Service (PST) turn. He led the group that underwent Breivik's 1518-page manifesto.

* Following is the police captain Vidar Saether from the NCIS. He will testify about the investigation of alleged Breivik's organization Knights Templar. We are always ready to answer any questions you may have about the trial or other questions about the terror case.

* Following is a police superintendent Anette Seip from the NCIS. She led the group that investigates Breivik purchase and procurement of equipment prior to the terrorist attack. They have looked at both the purchase of bomb ingredients, weapons and other things.

Judge Wenche Elizabeth Arntzen:

- The court is set. Prosecutors should we get a briefing first. [Holden: - Yes Honorable Court, the day shall be paid to the police investigation. It is quite challenging to compress the investigation in one day]

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

The first witness is the police chief Kenneth Wilberg of the Oslo police. He is a very experienced investigator who normally works as chief of the violent section of Oslo. During the first week of the trial of Breivik was Wilberg assessor for the prosecution. Today, the Inspector explain how the investigation team has been working and what is their mandate.

09:07:

VG:

- [Holden explains all the witnesses. Some of those will include an account of important issues that go on Breivik's manifest, how the investigation has been, the defendant's equipment acquisition, if Breivik Serbia-contact and his finance] [The witness oath]

09:09:

Witness Kenneth Wilberg, police chief:

[Kenneth Wilberg](#) - I work as an investigator at the violence section of the Oslo police and works with homicide and serious violent crime. I have worked with the investigation in this matter. Roughly you can say that we have made it so that the time between when Breivik parked Doblo to developers, until he was arrested on Utøya, they have taken responsibility for NCIS. In addition, the NCIS team a folder containing information for each deceased person. We have as far as possible tried to give their families the most information.



Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

Police Inspector Kenneth Wilberg sat in the corner of incarceration meeting when the bomb exploded 22 last July. He was principal investigator on the so-called

Bislett murder and was in court in that regard. There are only a few hundred meters from the courthouse in Oslo to its ministries. After the terrorist attack was Wilberg put on the case and has been central to the group that led the investigation.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Today it is almost exclusively located on the press belongs to the benches. After testimony from Utøya now over, and fagvitner have taken over the witness stand, few victims and survivors in court. Breivik sitting in the front row in the dock between two of its defenders, Vibeke Hein Bæra and Geir Lippestad. While Wilberg leave the main lines of investigation notes terrorist on a sheet he has ahead of him.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

Wilberg going through the main conclusions of the investigation, starting with the police have not found anyone that has helped Anders Breivik Behring physically or mentally.

09:13:

Witness Kenneth Wilberg, police chief:

- The investigation as a whole has taken the life of the accused from his birth until he was arrested. Some periods have gotten more attention than others. This day is set aside to account for the investigation and since it has been going on extensive investigation since 22 July, it is not possible to explain the whole matter at once. We will review the purpose of the investigation and the police's conclusions, then I will talk about the police organization and answer questions in that regard. We have chosen to go into how the investigation of the basic structure has been organized, it will give an outline of the relevant scope. The main themes which we will explain during the day is the analysis, description of how we work with information, how we can conclude that we do and on what basis we have concluded. Then we will go through the manifesto of the defendant, the Knights Templar, and the economy of the defendant and equipment procurement and conduct of terrorist acts. The research objective has been to provide the information necessary to determine the question of the charges, we will find out what has skjdd, when it happened, how it happened, who did what and if possible, why it happened.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

A total of about a thousand police officers were involved in one way or another in

the investigation of 22 July issue. It is carried out in 1127 the examination of witnesses. There have been 1,640 tips from the public. Investigation group consisted initially of 350 people. From August, it was reduced to 150 people. Today there are still 50 investigators working on it. Today being the first and foremost, follow-up, ie control of the work done.

09:15:

Witness Kenneth Wilberg, police chief:

- We will also answer whether there are helpers who are criminally responsible as described in the defendant and has contributed to the campaign either physically or mentally. The physical believed that contributed something active, such as purchasing and made bomb. With mental, we believe the influence and guidance to what has happened. The fact that there are two resting cells, as defendant argues, has been part of the investigation. [Holden: - This investigation is completely finished?] It is not over. [Holden: - Is it unusual that there is etterforskning during a trial?] It is quite common that it is there as it happens. The result of the police investigation, we concluded that we have identified physical or mental health aides to the terrorist attack on 22 July.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

prosecutor Svein Holden asked Ken Wilberg how confident they are that there are no intermediaries in this matter: - We feel confident that he has not had medvirkere of either physical or psychological injuries, said Wilberg. As he said this so Breivik right at him, expressionless, and began to write right afterwards.

09:17:

Witness Kenneth Wilberg, police chief:

- To arrive at this conclusion as the police have gathered much information. To conduct information gathering as well as possible, we have divided the investigation into projects. To give a picture of the quantity of the investigation in question, I will give an overview of the collection. The collection of material and informasjon is also helping to support the conclusions that the police have taken. From 22 July, we had about 300 investigators on the case. At the end of August as the number of investigators went down to about 150 and today we are about 50 still on the case. We feel confident in the conclusion we have reached, there is nothing in the material evidence that the defendant had accomplices. - We can say that the witness project which is then one of the projects, in Oslo conducted in

1127 the examination of witnesses, 456 of which are offended in the Oslo case, that bomb blast. I might also mention that several of those who have been questioned, has been questioned several times, sometimes over several days. We have welcomed more than 600 tips in the case, the job of the receiver has been to receive and record the tips. This has led to 219 interviews. These tips go to specific named conditions to be complicit, or other information. These are people who for fear of burn in with information, give them to the police. But we can also mention that some of the tips are deliberately incorrect information to lead us astray. In other tips may be disease involved. Case Analysis consists of analysts process and analyze information the, and it is based on the total v image that the police pull the konklusjonenevi doing. Claus will be in their testimonies provide further details of what made the basis for these conclusions.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna

Wilberg said that all mentioned in the manifesto to Breivik has been identified, but two women in a car and Breivik alleged mentor, "Richard the Lion Heart." Breivik wrote mainly just a first name in the manifest to protect those involved.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Kenneth Wilberg showcases how the investigation is organized, with the main groups and subgroups. All projects have been led by their project leader, who regularly have held a meeting point for exchanging information. Just before the trial started, we interviewed chief investigator John Roger Lund, who said that 22 July-investigation has been so massive that it has been impossible for each to have an overview of the entire material as is natural in an ordinary criminal case. Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

The case consists of 120 binders containing 60,000 investigative documents.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

One of the project groups have been responsible for data seizure and social media. They have produced 240 reports, made 228 seizures and fuses, and sent 293 requests measures to 11 countries. - We can not say that we have full control of the defendant's activity online, says Wilberg. Prosecutors Svein Holden wants to know why they do not have complete control. - Because it is the internet - a medium it is impossible to have complete control, answer Wilberg. He points out that, for example, easily create anonymous email addresses.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

Anders Behring Breivik notes diligently as Wilberg said that it is impossible to have

full control over the activity on the web.

09:28:

Witness Kenneth Wilberg, police chief:

- As a result, standing on Knights Templar in the manifesto was the investigation focused on the Knights Templar. This is the organization that the defendant believed was established in 2002 in London. Etterforskningnen should provide information to deny or confirm whether the organization exists. It was important to disprove whether there were accomplices if there was an established organization. If a certain kind of security could say that it does not exist, it would give the investigation an important contribution in terms of resources and that we were able to carry out the investigation. Police concluded that the police have not found evidence that the Knights Templar exist in the form describes the accused. We also have a project called relatives, to ensure information needs of relatives in Norway. 29 contacts in a total of 26 police districts. [Holden: - Are all the police involved?] All but Gudbrandsdalen. I can also mention that in connection with the case have been made 5000 seizures and those systematized in such a way that it is driven into a database so that in turn can be connected to other people. To date, the case of 120 papers and about 60 000 pages of investigative material. - Video Project, which is passed through 60,000 hours of video footage, and it made 64 findings of the defendant and the vehicles he has outlined. The findings coincide with what the defendant has explained, there is no other than the defendants who are on those pictures, and he has no more cars. So it is fitting the data group. It has focused on the defendant's data activity on their own computers and the internet. We have also taken hold of the defendant's activity on social media. The focus has been to identify other people he has communicated with, to find out if he was alone or not. This group has submitted 240 reports, made 228 seizures, and sent 293 requests to 11 other countries. - We can not say that we have full control over tilaltes activity online, but we have documented what we found. [Holden: What is the reason that you do not have full control?] The Internet is a medium that it is impossible to control. It is possible to create email addresses and send messages without links an identity to it, you can communicate without the police can say that we have full control of everything he has done on the internet. Comments from VG Marianne bay:

the very beginning there was a question from one of the players on the computer game World of Warcraft, which Breivik played full time in one year. Kenneth Wilberg says that the police have obtained descriptions of this game from different countries: United States: The game is described as a game that sometimes involves magic and melee. Europe: The game is described as it contains violence of the unrealistic nature of Australia: The game is described as it contains unrealistic violence.

09:36:

Witness Kenneth Wilberg, police chief:

- Yes, I was asked a question in the introduction of the judge on World of Warcraft is a violent game. We obtained the four major rating companies have said about World of Warcraft. In the U.S. it is described as a game that "sometimes involving magic and melee." In Europe, it is characterized as "violence of the unrealistic character." In Australia it is referred to as "unrealistic violence." [Shows two screenshots from scenes in the game.] Finally, the manifesto, or compendium, of the defendant. Originally he tried to send it out to 8109 email accounts. But because of a spam filter at Telenor is only possible to send out 1000 a day. 1022 email addresses were sent to the manifest. 959 email addresses received it in fact. The reason for the difference is that some email addresses may be deleted or have a full mailbox. [Reader looked up statistics on what the police have categories used to classify the recipients of the Manifesto. Among these are 219 parliamentary politicians.] Some create emails without it being associated with an identity, and it makes it difficult to find out who these people behind the email addresses are. It is only now in court that the accused has said that one of the recipients have been associated with the Knights Templar. It has not been known previously.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

Anders Breivik Behring tried to send the manifesto to 8109 people, but it just went out to 1002 since Telenor has a spam filter that only allows you to send thousands of e-mails a day. There were 849 people who actually got it. Distributed as follows: Himself - a family - 8 Friends / acquaintances - 22 Former colleagues - 2 Ideology - 7 Wow players - 7 Politicians - Parliament - 219 Politicians - Political parties Norway - 90 Politicians - Sweden - 4 Municipalities - 13 Media - 392 Possible media - 93

09:38:

Witness Kenneth Wilberg, police chief:

- Although it had been possible to identify 8,000 people had to have a thorough analysis on the relationship that they have in the matter. As things stand today is not something we're going to prioritize. Breivik said in court by one of these 8109 belonged to a person in the Knights Templar. [Holden: - When the question is: put the police down and try to verify a the over 7,000 e-mail addresses that we are not sure of who belong?] The answer is no. To give a numerical example: We have questioned 2,000 people in the case, if we are talking about 8000 in Norway and internationally, and do not know the identity behind the address. [Holden: - How do the police the opportunity to identify the people behind the e-mail addresses?] It is possible to do, but it must be a reason to go for it. That is if the analyzes had pointed to a specific e-mail address, but we have no evidence that goes in one direction or the other. [Police explains that a total of 55 persons identified in the manifest. Of these, 48 examined. Two are identified, but not questioned. This is the husband of the sister of the accused, who lives in the United States. The other is a person who attended Smestad school with the accused, that far back in time. 5 people are not identisert, among them "Richard Lionheart" as described in the manifest.] - [Defense Lippestad: - Just so I'm sure I have been with me lately ... The last thing you said that means about 8,000 e-mail addresses Breivik tried to send to the manifesto, they know not who is?] We know who many are, but there are some we do not know who is. [Lippestad: - But is it so that it is between 7-8000 e-mail addresses you do not know who is?] That is correct. [Holden: - There has been speculation in the media regarding a Serb, Pelemis. During the case it was a Bosnian newspaper that printed an article that launched this person Breivik possible contact in Serbia. Have the police investigated this?] Yes, we obtained the article and had translated it and considered it. It was about this Pelemis. He could be Breivik contact. But that's how we read the article later, it's a claim that is submitted without that there should be reason to investigate further. - There is

only on the article carved a sign of the [...] on the picture taken by the defendant here in court, with a Serbian symbol that you can connect with nationalism. It does not appear as an article which we will review, we have taken it, translated it and rated it. [Siv Hallgren: - I have a question about Breivik has played Call of Duty, do you know that?] I know it, but not the details around it. Can not answer the number of hours and statistics on that. It is a game that has been played [Arntzen: - Are there any questions?] [Inga Bejer Engh - I just wonder one thing, where you started to summarize the investigation that the police attach little to the Knights Templar and have not found that he had medvirkere. If it were possible mail addresses could change this, you would then reviewed them?] Well, I was a misguided analysis, which may have said that one of these was more comprehensive than the others. [Engh: - Yes, that is, that you feel confident in the conclusion, even if you have not gone in and identified these e-mail addresses?] Yes, for the case consists of much more than these email addresses.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

A few days after the trial of Anders Behring Breivik started, published the Bosnian news magazine Slobodna Bosna an article in which it was alleged that one of the killers from Srebrenica massacre, Milorad Pelemis, should have been Breivik Serb contact. Both in interviews and in the so-called manifesto har Breivik claimed that he met a wanted Serb in Liberia and that this man is affiliated with Knights Templars. Prosecutors Svein Holden would know what the police have found out about this. - We have collected and translated the article. There was an article that said Pelemis be Breivik contact, but that as we read it, this assertions made without that we have found reason to verify a them, answer Wilberg. He added that it "was carved into" a sign of the thumb to Breivik, the image that the magazine used in this case - a picture from the courtroom. According Wilberg is a Serbian symbol.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

Anders Breivik Behring claimed in court that one of the 8109 people he sent to the manifesto is another cell in the Knights Templar. This was the first time he said it. Wilberg said of the questions from the prosecutor Svein Holden that it is not appropriate for the police to verify a further. There is no other information in the case suggesting that Breivik is telling the truth, or some special e-mail addresses that stand out. - It will not just be looking for a needle in høystokken but one needle among 8000 other needle, said Wilberg.

09:45:

Witness Kenneth Wilberg, police chief:

- Lawyer Larsen: Breivik has explained that he was delayed when he had to send out notifications. He sent it on Friday, before the bomb. Do you have any documentation on when it is sent and when it is received in the mail? The time when he began to send out, we have, but I have no right here. [The prosecutor Holden: Wilberg can come back to this later.] [Defense Lippestad: The police have sent 44 requests to foreign countries. But they are waiting for a response in 10 of these. Which ten have not been answered? And this is related to the mentioned Serb] No, the Serb has been answered. [Lippestad: What to wait an answer?] People that he has traded off, as we have documented. But the details of this is a separate project on. I can not give any more detailed response than that. [Lippestad: Got it. Another question: You said you do not believe that the Knights Templar exist "in the form" defendants believe that exists. But the defendant has two forms, he believes it exists in. He said that the first presentation of this was pompous and actually consists of 4-5 KT 6 people. In what form have you investigated this?]

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Kenneth Wilberg certificate triggers a lot of questions from the players - even from the lay judges. One of them, Ernst Henning Eielsen (46), just took the word and asked whether the police have investigated Breivik's communication with the people he played World of Warcraft. Wilberg said they have made questioning, but nothing beyond that.

09:46:

Witness Kenneth Wilberg, police chief:

- What is real is an establishment meeting in London in May and the Baltic States and there are no changes. [Defense Lippestad: - So it is simply whether there has been a meeting in 2002 that you have investigated?] Yes, and in the Baltics and whether there is another motive for traveling than the defendant asserts, but you'll get a pretty thorough review of the Knights Templar later. [Dry Ice: - Facebook accounts, you have gained access to them or other means of access to information from others who have written to Breivik, or how is it possible? Can you say something about his way to express themselves on and activity on the Internet?] We have the 240 reports describing activity on the Internet. We have something on Facebook, but there are still things we are waiting for. - But I must get checked and get back to. [Dry Ice: - But there has been some analysis that is?] What are you thinking then? [Dry Ice: - We have been available several reports that have been from the investigation that we have not been able to reproduced. This

with Facebook, there are also reports in the project that we can use?] Then I just refer to the reports that are written in the case. So if the report is adequate for what you are wondering, I can not answer. [Judge Arntzen: - Contains the reports examples of Facebook communication?] I must get back to, it is too detailed. [Arntzen: - Yes, okay, then we can take it at the end of the day.]

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

Defender Mostly Grounded ask the first question at the trial. Geir Lippestad and Vibeke Hein Bæra called the two young medforsvarerne in the back row for "IT experts". Grounded wonder if the police have investigated e-mail provider "Hushmail" as Breivik even recommend the Manifesto. Wilberg said they have not done it since Hushmail uses a system that encrypts the communication, so that even if the police had seized, they would not have been able to read the information without the encryption key.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Kenneth Wilberg has now finished his diploma. Next witness is the police captain Alf Claus. He works as a normal tactical investigator in the Criminal Police. Like the Wilberg has also been assessor Claus during the trial and has been sitting in the back room where the policemen follow the case. Claus is the second in command of the analysis group, which has served with the tactical overview of the investigation. The group has always received the material from all the other subgroups and systematized it. There has also made time lines, broken figures and made lists of telecommunications data.

9:50:

Witness Kenneth Wilberg, police chief:

- [Arntzen: Have the members questions?] [Lay judge Ernst Henning Eielsen: - Have you made any assessment of social interaction that has been done in WoW?] Nothing but the examination of witnesses on his has been playing with. [Holden: - When it comes to questions from the Larsen-first time for the dispatch of the manifesto was 1409, last 1442.] [Defense Isolated Ground: - Breivik has recommended a particular user, Hushmail, you have written letters to them to confirm whether he had one or more email accounts there?] We have left no specific, but we are aware that this is a krypteringsvektøy, you must have the encryption key to understanding the emails. Although we had made claim to such an account, so will what we got out to have been encrypted. [Larsen: I have a question on the message, there are some that when they receive this manifesto, there are many receivers, politicians, etc., someone responded, contacted the

police?] Not that I know, I know was that we found this manifesto or compendium online during the evening. - [Judge Arntzen: I have a question about the games "Call of Duty" and "Modern Warfare" as we have heard about. Can you say about these games? Are they in the same category as the "World of Warcraft", or is this purely violent games?] Modern Warfare and Call of Duty is the same game. It's just different versions with different names. [Judge Arntzen: Can you tell us about what kind of game this is?] There are violent games, violence, realistic games. There are probably 16 or 18-year limit on these games. [Judge Arntzen: When we say so far thanks to you. You got a little homework you can get back to us later.]


Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Anders Breivik Behring is mostly looking straight ahead during Santa's introduction. But recently he turned to defend Vibeke Hein Bæra, who sits on his left side, and looked at her computer for a while. Now Bæra just sent this computer to their colleagues Odd Ivar Green and Isolated Ground, sitting in the row behind. The two are now to work with it.

9:54:

Witness Alf Nissen, police superintendent:

[Alf Nissen](#) - [The witness oath] [The prosecutor Holden: - Can you tell us about what you work with?] I was running crime analyst at NCIS. Where I've been working the past six years and works in 22/7-enheten and has worked there now since the attack. I have worked with the analysis for 12 years. [The prosecutor Holden: - Then you can start with what you intend to tell us] Now Wilberg told about the investigation mandate and how the investigation team was made up. What I will tell you about the investigation that has been done to document Breivik's life.



09:56:

Witness Alf Nissen, police superintendent NCIS:

- The division, which Wilberg said, there Breivik parked car by Utvika. Oslo-project that I've been a part of whose mandate is to look at all the information from Breivik's birth to when Utvika. As you know it's a case of massive information gathering. Early I had to have a system to process and be able to look at the totality of the case to keep track and not miss the simple things that could be important. [The witness present methods, which they are divided into the three

main elements of the collection, processing and analysis.] Projects have gathered information, and often also processed it and then sent it on to us. Economics, for example, the obtained information about Breivik's economy from ten years ago, and has even done an analysis of this, which they have expertise.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

In order to explain how they worked, according to Alf Claus is a summary screen that illustrates how they have broken down the massive material. In order to systematize, they divided the information into various events. This has made a timeline of well over 100 meters. Breivik included on the canvas he is right in front of him. In total there are three such letter here in the hall 250

09:58:

Witness Alf Nissen, police superintendent NCIS:

- I will try to describe the system we have in place to get an overview. So I have the following picture, you see it's object, relational, time and place. We take hold of it and identifies unique objects, people, account number, car registration number and so on, and put it in a database. Same can be a document in seizures, we pull out all the unique objects in the bracket we find relevant. In addition, we have relationships. To build up a network in the base of relationships. In addition, we are of course concerned with the time and place, incidents, when what happens. That is, small pieces of information that says anything about when something happens, time and place. - When someone says in an interview that they have had a meeting at a particular place as we record in the database, so we go through these interviews and record objects. [Holden: - When you told me this at an early stage, we agreed that we had to have some examples.] I have made an example of the information we have on 11 July 2011, there is no specific date, there is nothing exciting, but is a day with an average amount of good information. The first is an excerpt from the diary section of the manifesto, which he has written an epistle about what he did that day, there was no money on the card so he had to go to the city in the North, which we assume is Rena. This is called a subjective amount of information. There is something Breivik communicate in the manifesto that we basically can not take for granted. We must verify, through the objective information.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

While Nissen witnesses is the four expert witnesses generally, looking at him, or on their computer. But when the police officer from the Criminal Police read out from Breivik's diary from the manifest, then the right psychiatrist Terje Tørrissen

inquiring of the defendant. He kept his eyes on him for long. Breivik sit quietly in the chair provided. From GPS from Fiat Doblo that Breivik used Utøya police have picked up 60,000 points that they have analyzed. Claus right now shows a sample from a random day, 11 July 2011, to illustrate the type of information they have broken down and put into the system. There is everything from ATM withdrawals to which websites Breivik surfed on. In Nissen presentation he showed a surveillance photo of Breivik, moving away from an ATM at Rena eleven days before the terrorist attacks. The terrorist looked at the picture, but it was not possible to discern visible reaction in his face.

10:06:

Witness Alf Nissen, police superintendent:

- If we go further we get results in the data log from the defendant's computer, which was found in Hoff Road. Here it appears that this day we open an episode of "Rome" from an external hard drive. The surf on the internet, for vg.no and at 11 visited avis.no's "contact us" pages. At 11:02 it is called Avis. At 11.35 made a google search with the words Volkswagen and (...). At 11:39 there is a phone call from Avis to Breivik tel. At 11.45 clicked it on your PC to gebyrfri.no. It had Breivik a credit card. At 11:46 dialed it back to Avis from Breivik phone. Again, the sources of data log on the PC. This is confirmed by statements. 11:59 dialed it to Broadband Guide. Then it logs onto hotmail account anders.behring @ hotmail.com 24:16 visited kjendis.no then register the journey with the GPS, which can be plotted on a map. It found a receipt, with a deposit of 15,000 dollars, inbetalt via Coop Prix Rena post office. Furthermore, we find a receipt in which it traded cash food Coop Prix Rena. We look at the receipt that it traded gourmet food and candy, which agrees with what is in the manifest. - Because all traffic data gives us information from the antenna it is from and therefore which area he is in. GPS has a new trip from Rena and he ends up in the same place. He thus goes from there, going half way, but comes back again. He is back at 3:03 p.m. Rena. 3:06 p.m., we see it is the withdrawal of \$ 4,000 in Sparebanken Hedmark in Focus. 3:07 p.m. is the output of 4500 million in Ya-bank. Then there is the removal of 4500 million in Hedmark from Kash. [The witness shows the image of Breivik away from the ATM at 3:08 p.m.] Breivik is 3:24 p.m. on Vålstua farm that is the end of the journey. Opens at 21:30 Breivik an episode of the TV series "Rome" from an external hard drive.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

The police inspector Atle Roll-Matthiesen and police superintendent John Roger Lund sitting in the audience when police investigations are presented to the judges

of the 22 July issue. Matthiesen's outgoing head of the tactical investigation department of the Criminal Police, while Lund has led 22 July-unit to the police. Lund is working on a daily basis as the chief investigator at the Department for organized crime in the Oslo police.

10:10:

Witness Alf Nissen, police superintendent NCIS:

- [Holden: - This is an example of a non-special day?] I will not lie, this is a day of good information flow. But in recent months, we have some information per day, so the 11 July is not a special day in recent months. The purpose is to document Breivik's movements and contacts. When we document this, it also leads to further investigation, with examination of contacts and further investigations of the movements that we think are especially interesting. This has also been used to control Breivik explanation. Then we can give good objective evidence of what he explains all about. When I say that we have a lot of objective evidence, that is, electronic evidence, we have attempted to determine whether it may be possible for a person to carry out the actions and movements we have seen. We have compared the day to day, minute by minute. That is, if we have a bompasering at Breivik Doblo in Oslo at 11, and a withdrawal from the ATM in Rena five over 11 that night, so it is impossible that one person has managed both. Ergo, there must be a person who was driving the car, and a person who made the withdrawal from the ATM.

VG:

- [Breivik are now talking with his defense Geir Lippestad, while Alf Claus summarizes the work of the court]

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Breivik a broad smile when Nissen explains how they have worked on the analysis of telecommunications data. He turns to defending Vibeke Hein Bæra and whispers something to her briefly before he settles down again. Then she leans against Breivik and whispers something in return. Now, Breivik leaned against Geir Lippestad and chatting with him for a while. Bæra notes very much on an A4 pad of this diploma.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna

Nissen emphasized that the analysis work can only prove the facts they find. - We can look and look, but it is impossible to prove that something does not exist, he stressed.

10:11:

Witness Alf Nissen, police superintendent NCIS:

- But that thought in mind, we have gone through all the objective evidence to see if there is any discrepancy. Are there any places where they are generated in two forskjellige places, so close in time that it is impossible to move between the two, but we have not been able to find. There have been many tips, some serious, but not all are equally plausible. Our task is to see if it is possible that Breivik has been on the train ride, then we can consider the testimony and the tip. - The more information we get, the better the picture we get of the case. All the time we have considered new investigative steps of the projects that have brought in new information. This is to identify interesting relationships that have been our main goal. For example, we obtained useful information from base stations, on the farm, on Utøya and repository Breivik was near the Swedish border. We have collected all the traffic that had covered the base station, we ended up with over 220,000 unique phone numbers. Trying to identify 220,000 phone takes too long, but we've added all of the same base, so that if we sit in an interrogation and enter a number that is identical to one of these, then we'll know about it.

Comment by Marianne Vika VG:

Analysis Group has created a timeline that stretches over 100 meters. It starts in 1979 when Breivik was born, and ends 22 last July. This timeline contains what he has done in life, such as involvement in politics, computer gaming, business and international travel. Nissen is now showing excerpts from this timeline on the screen. He says that there are two periods stand out: the summer 2006 and summer 2009, where they see is a transition from something to something else. The four remaining witnesses today will elaborate on this.

10:18:

Witness Alf Nissen, police superintendent:

- Has this issue been found on a label under seizure at home Breivik, we know it. The same applies to toll passes 21 and 22 July. We have not only taken pictures of the cars to Breivik, but all the cars that passed in the minutes before and after him, in case some friends of his were with as helpers and drove before or after him. If a number of your car from the toll booth pops up somewhere else in the case, for example, was parked at the pier to Utøya, then it is flagged. But again, this has not led to anything like that. We have not found any people with

interesting movements that we wanted to investigate further. The idea of mapping information has been to achieve this. Through this comprehensive information retrieval, we have categorized much of Breivik's life. We have not identified medvirkere to Breivik. In theory, it is impossible to prove that something does not exist. We can confirm that something exists, but not that it does not exist. The only thing we can do is to look and look and look and then, at a certain point, conclude that it does not exist. To be able to get an overview we divided up into four Breivik's life. The first stage is childhood (from birth to adolescence). There were themes of child welfare and violence episodes he talks about. So from 1997 to May 2009. 15. May 2009, he'll create Geofarm, which is the first objective evidence that he is planning something. Moreover, we became interested in the summer of 2009 where he moved home to his mother and writing of the manifesto, and up to 19 July 2011. The last period is from 19.7 to 22.7, where the minute we seek to determine what he did until the government quarter and Utøya.

10:19:

Witness Alf Nissen, police superintendent NCIS:

- A very simplified timeline might look like this: We see the beginning of 1997 onwards, his involvement in the FPU and the Progress Party. We also see his companies. We also see that he has been with shares in 1997-98 period. The policy is part of the Knights Templar theme. Then we see a bar for WoW. This period, he has a residence in which he has not paid the subscription and then pay him for another term. So we have a bar for overseas trips of his. Then there is a bar for weapons training. Manifest section is broken because we are struggling to have objective information about when he began work as he says himself that began in 2006. We know it was working on the last day before it was sent out by e-mail. If you had to say something about this timeline, there are two periods that stand out that it goes from being something to something else.

Comment by Marianne Vika VG:

Right Psychiatrist Terje Tørrissen see enough once long Breivik when Claus stuff out that there is no objective evidence to suggest that Breivik has planned terror before 2006. Shortly after leaning terrorism charges is probably once defending against Lippestad and whispers something. Lippestad questions, especially about a shotgun Breivik acquired in 2003 - and why he did not come into this. Nissen says that there are other witnesses later today to utgreie this.

Witness Alf Nissen, police superintendent NCIS:

- I do not think too much, but a period in summer 2006 and summer 2009, the

periods where we see that there is a transition from something to something else. And what we can see from the period before 2006, it is so we can find no objective evidence, or witness statements, which describe the Breivik says he has done it with the Knights Templar, etc. There is certainly nothing to suggest that Breivik planning something. After 2006, some witness statements indicate that he is working on a book, etc. But it frste objective proof that something is going on, is the establishment of GeoFarm, 15 May 2009. Before that, it's because Breivik's own statement that we take into account, but otherwise it is the objective evidence, then there is nothing before 2006. - [Holden: - No further questions from my side] [Arntzen: - Have the defenders questions ?] [Lippestad: - Yes, just a few. Only the last image first. We also know that Breivik had a shotgun. Do you have the information?] - We have information about, it got him in 2003. [Lippestad: - But you said it was not until objective information until 2006, but where there is objective information that is in 2003?] Yes. [Lippestad: - You have analyzed this to Breivik explanation. Have you found any discrepancies between his testimony and the objective information that you have analyzed?] - No, basically it has Breivik been cooperative, and what he has said about has turned out to vote with the objective evidence. With regard to memory, and the fact that he has written something wrong in the diary, not on purpose, it has turned out to vote. [Lippestad: - Is it for your experience in his explanation, much detail he remembers, or is it small?] It is both. [Lippestad: - Can you tell us more about it] Now I'm not the best to answer it, the questioning will be better. Something he says he will not give evidence about other things he can not remember, other things he has a particularly good representation of. [Lippestad: - Can you give some example?] Do not think I put too much out of it, but he has a special interest in enkelte themes, such as bomb production, as he can tell the detail.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

Defender Geir Lippestad are impressed by the police analysis, but are wondering what opportunities exist to hide their tracks. Police Superintendent Alf Nissen replies that he has no trouble admitting that it is possible to make efforts to hide from police. - There is no problem to not generate electronic tracks or generate false tracks. If then no one has seen anything, so we can not find anything, emphasizes Claus.

Comments from VG Marianne bay:

Judge Wenche Arntzen earlier in the trial asked a lot about Breivik's video game playing. Now she just asked a question whether the police have checked whether the defendant had subscribed there before 2006. Nissen says that they have asked the supplier about all the info and that they have received feedback that he first registered in 2006. Arntzen wonder if they've found another game activity before

2006, such as Modern Warfare. Nissen says he believes Breivik started playing this in 2010, but that he must come back to this if the judge will have the exact date.

10:29:

Witness Alf Nissen, police superintendent:

- [Defense Lippestad: - A question: You could map out a day after almost every minute it seems. Is there anything a person would not be detected can do that you have less objective information, and come under the radar you put up?] There is no problem to not generate electronic tracks, or generate false electronic tracks. [Defense Lippestad: - If you take out the battery to your mobile phone, it will remove the ability to track this?] No, I will not register. [Lawyer Larsen: - You chose 11.7 as a random day. Up to 22 July, they resemble each other?] Yes. Some stand out slightly. July as a whole gives the impression that he is working continuously with the bomb. [Larsen: - Has he been on any sites you have reacted?] No. But we will not respond to that he goes into the pages of bomb production. Even though it is something to react. [Larsen: - Does he stressed?] There is no hectic at what he does. [Judge Arntzen: - World of Warcraft. There it is registered a first subscription in 2006. Have you investigated whether there are previous records of this game?] World of Warcraft was probably not in 2000. But we have applied earlier. [Judge Arntzen: - Do you remember how long ago was this?] [The prosecutor Holden: - For the sake of clarity, judge: World of Warcraft was launched in Norway in 2005.] [Judge Arntzen: - Okay, but other games have you not investigated?] No. [Judge Arntzen: - Ok, we have come to a pause. We meet again at ten forty-five.]

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

The court has now taken a break until 10:45. Next witness is a police superintendent Day Uppheim from the Police Security Service (PST). Uppheim jobs to the common as an investigator in the PST, and has a background of violence section of the Oslo police, where he was one of the principal investigators on Jeddi-killing. He has led the group that underwent Breivik's 1518-page manifesto. The report was delivered on 16 December last year. The group has also reviewed some of the statements in the manifesto, analyzed it appears on the Knights Templar, Breivik Security to future terrorists. defendant has now been taken back in the saddle. The judges are on the way. Next witness, Day Uppheim from the PST, have already taken the witness stand.

10:52:

VG:

- [Judge Arntzen: - The court is set] Holden wonder there was anything the court felt were missing or were pending in connection with Wilberg explanation. Especially around the dry ice Facebook question earlier today. Dry Ice says he understands that there is a great material, but thinks that it may be interesting things to get around Breivik's Facebook activity. Holden suggests that an investigator talk to the experts during a break to find an appropriate solution for any unanswered questions about this subject. The judge says that it can be stated where in the investigation Facebook given time.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

The defendant notes as part of Day Uppheim PST start their diploma. He has led the group that underwent the manifest.

10:53:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

[Dag Uppheim](#) - [Judge Arntzen taking the next witness under oath. The Day Uppheim. He works at the usual investigating the PST, and has led the group that underwent Breivik's 1518-page manifesto.] I can start by telling a little about the work of the Manifesto. PST was asked by the Oslo Police District to review the allegations in this manifesto. We have been working on this as a separate project, detached from the PST's other activities. Our goal and mission in this project manifest, has been to convey to the other projects information that can assist them in their work.



Comments from VG Jarle Brenna

Day Uppheim stressed that they have not aimed to disprove the allegations that Breivik may have in the manifest. They only looked at the content - without having to take a stand.

10:55:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- For example, information about the movements and activities that the defendant described in the manifest. Embedment of equipment and a number of such things.

Anything that can be verified and give us an understanding of what the defendant has done, and if he has been able to do it alone. We have reports that summarize what is presented on various topics. For example, what he says about different datapill, what he says about the economy and so on. Everything he says about the organization called the Knights Templar. - To the extent that I am referring to the contents of the manifesto in my testimony, refer I to have arisen and regardless of the defendant has told about this and what the investigation in general have found out about these temaene. The manifesto is one of several sources of information that is important, but it is something the defendant himself has influenced the design of, and we must accept that there is such defendants want it to appear to a wider audience. The manifesto is a document which in the case, and we have written a report that describes the shape, structure and content. In advance of this vitmålet we have been asked by the prosecutor to give the court an outline of what the manifesto is. It is extensive and I have prepared a presentation that takes about an hour. It is perhaps unnecessary to point out but such a presentation of such a document will arouse eventuelle shades.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Breivik leans back in his chair and tilts back and forth while Uppheim says that the police have called the defendant's written as "manifest" and not "compendium" as Breivik himself has described it as. Uppheim say they use the "manifest" because that name was quickly incorporated into both the police and the media. The defendant will alternate between looking at the canvas, where Uppheim now shows the front of the manifesto, and take notes.

11:01:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST :

- I have no chance to get in on all the parts described in the manifest. I reproduce the content as it is, I'm considering it. We have not had the intention to disprove the ideological perspectives and the historical representation of the document. I aimed at an oral presentation. As you listen, I use the term "manifest". The reason is that this concept was so clearly established in early etterforskningen. The defendant spoke of it as a compendium. It was the original 1518 pages in a Word document. We produced a working copy with greater skriftstørrelse, size 11 The document was then 1801 pages. The Manifesto was written in English. Content is strukturert in three books, which in turn is divided into sections. There is a table of contents 10 pages initially. The manifesto is entitled "2083: A European declaration of independence." There are two lines of text written in Latin on the front page. It is the name of a book written in the 1100s by a monk, the Knights

Templar. The manifesto will show that the fear of islamifisering not irrational. It is described as a gift to the recipient, and it is pointed out that much of the information it contains is held back by politicians and media. The defendant writes to have spent nine years on the project.

Comments from VG Marianne bay:

As usual, there is a large police presence in the courtroom 250 To the right of Breivik, between the dock and the door to the back room sit two police officers. Behind him on the left sits a custody. There are also two other arrestforvarere in the room, one of them next to support the lawyers, the other belongs in the hall. Still note Breivik much on a white sheet of paper he had in front. The experts and cast a glance towards him under Uppheim presentation of the investigation of Breivik's manifesto.

11:04:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- In the early years are spent on studies and funding, and the next on the research and writing. He has spent 317 000 euros in the process of which 187,500 euro represents lost income in the last three years. It is described as barely noticeable compared to the sacrifice made for the marketing and distribution. The manifesto is in three books. The book's part one can be considered as a historical part. It is 284 pages divided in 30 sections. - There are also transcripts of interviews and transcript or excerpt from a documentary. I can name a few chapters that deal with Crusaders, made up of undocumented and unstructured chapters, I can name a few chapters that deal with Kosovo. Articles are taken from blogs and websites such as "Jihad Watch" and "Gates of Vienna." Key named writers include the Norwegian blogger "Fjordman". With a large portion of the text is original sources available on the internet. Some of the articles missing references, but it does not seem as if the defendant wishes to present it as if it is he who has written parts of the text he has written. He admits in the introduction that he wrote about half himself. - The various articles differ on the structure and uttryksform, something which makes it difficult to read. Although some of the articles are well written and well structured, it is free-standing articles that are inserted into a whole. Can not rule out that someone with a different starting point than mine, will find it easier to read. In other articles, it is made small adjustments by replacing or removing words. The defendant intends to provide a thorough analysis of Islam, as we see from the title of book one, is hidden or falsified by authorities. - There are described various articles of genocide throughout history described as a direct consequence of Islam exist with other cultures. It says that there are three bøgger

of Jihad against Europe. Now underway is a third which is a consequence of that we have opened our borders to masseinnvandring by Muslims. They are peaceful now, but will first show its true face when they are in a position of strength. Book two has the title Europe Burning "appears more structured than book one. It has underkaptiler and is structured and arranged under the theme, as we see here on screen. With this perspective that this presentation is given, I have no opportunity to go into each topic tenkelt

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Day Uppheim goes through how Breivik has cut and pasted text. One of them is Ted Kaczynski, who colloquially known as Una-bomber. He wrote "Unabomber's manifesto" in the context of their terrorist actions. He killed three people, and injured an additional 23 with his 16 bombs he sent to universities and airlines. Two days after the terrorist attacks on the government building and Utøya, we wrote [this article](#) where we presented how Breivik copied Kaczynski.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna

Uppheim informs the court that Anders Behring Breivik reviews Fjordman as his favorite contemporary authors. Approximately 320 pages from 45 different articles published by Fjordman is included in the manifest. Blogger Fjordman is actually named Peder Are Nøstvold Jensen, and paints a gloomy picture of reality. He is highly critical of Islam. According to the manifesto that Breivik did not know about Fjordman until after six years of work on the manifest, and to his surprise, he discovered then that Fjordman had written about many of the same subjects as him.

11:12:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- Book two is bulky and it is difficult to briefly summarize the contents. The book, in sum portrays a dramatic real time Europe. Writing about how Islam is incompatible with democracy. In addition to the threat that Islam poses, it is pointed out how multikulturalisme is to undermine our culture. It is argued that the power elite in Europe is in a conspiracy to islamifisere parts of Europe. The text is not part of other sources on the Internet. We assume that the defendant has written about 80 pages of book 2 Some texts written by others has been edited by the fact that some words are exchanged. A text written by the so-called Una-bomber. He was concerned about the technological development, and wrote a letter which was published in several newspapers. Here, defendant replaced the term "leftism" replaced with "multi-culturealism." Much of the manifesto is taken

from the Islam-critical websites. Robert Spencer and Andrew Bosteon listed with multiple reference. The writer who differs markedly from the others, the Norwegian Fjord blogger Mann. Together, his writing a text size of 320 pages to our working copy. The articles contained Fjord Mann is first published in 2006 and 2008. [Breivik follows the alert] It appears that he has not met Fjord Man and he discovered only after having worked with a compendium of six months.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Uppheim says Breivik's manifest contains a lot of cut and paste, and that it is difficult to determine how much the defendant has written himself. He adds that Breivik clearly present in the manifest. When Uppheim says that there is much repetition in the letter, Breivik leans back in his office chair and tilts back and forth until he gets back into position.

11:14:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- Here we see examples of headline in some articles from "Fjordman". [This shows on the screen right] "A European Declaration of Independence" [the first heading takes Uppheim for himself and says:] "Fjordman" paints a rather dramatic picture of the situation in Europe. [Holden: - Did you say that "Fjordman" wrote this the first time in 2002?] No, 'A European Declaration of Independence "was as far as I know, published in March 2007. It is incorporated in its entirety in book number 2 As a summary of the first two books are largely made up of available material from the internet. It is from Islam-critical websites defendant has taken it from and are seldom written anything themselves, and the Norwegian blogger "Fjordman" text is the scope. The text written by the defendant himself is the phase division and category A - and B-traitors. - Despite contains Book 1 and Book 2 is not the actual violence fungal claims that we will see in book 3 Apart from a picture of a temple knight, brought not the organization "Knights Templar" on track in the first two books. Book 3, "A declaration of pre-emptive war", 878 pages, 162 sections and 14 topics. As the title suggests, it is declared in advance of war. The book is a kind of declaration of war, in which readers are encouraged to take part in an ongoing civil war in Europe. Book 3 is gradually becoming a more personal touch. This is the book we have spent the most time in the investigation, and this is also written more defendants themselves. But there is still much cut from the internet and largely restructured and rewritten. The overall impression is a lot of cutting and pasting, rewriting and editing, but the defendant is still largely present in the text.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

All players have pre-dealt a stack of sheets containing sammenstiftede Dag Uppheim presentation of how they have investigated the manifest. The actors look down on the table, supplied and browsing in this while the police officer talking.

11:17:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- Specialty headline in book three, the book provides a sort of overall structure. But the material is difficult because a lot of repetitions. In the first issue in book three, it is argued why the armed resistance is required. The guilty after the charges are referred to as traitors. The manifesto is divided traitors in four kateogirer, A, B, C and D. The prescribed penalties for different categories: A, for the death penalty, as prescribed for B, which is a larger group. - In addition to the use of percent returns and the traitors categorized as the former group, there is division in phases. An ongoing civil war in Europe is divided and in phases; Dialogue phase is behind us and we are now in phase one, which runs until 2030, and overlap of phase two. Phase three in 2083, which we recognize from the title of the Manifesto. It offered pardon to the governments of Western Europe if they surrender within 112,020. It is described on European matters, just eksempler from Norway. He appeals to multiple sequences, the 19 countries listed here in this sequence. As we see, the claim is filed on behalf of the organization Knights Templar.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Breivik got a smiling dragon across his face as Uppheim told about what the manifesto says the tombstones to the Knight Templars, knights and rituals.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

Judge Wenche Arntzen interrupt and ask questions of Uppheim whether the descriptions of uniforms and medals perceived as proposed or existing system. The question comes because Breivik in recent months has moderated and said that it was only a proposal. - You are doing it, both the rituals and the medal ceremony, but if there are any suggestions or existing, I think is a bit difficult to answer. I should think a bit about it and come back, answer Uppheim.

11:23:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- (...) This organization, the Knights Templar, is described as a separate issue in

the manifesto. In this issue of the Manifesto describes a re-establishment of Knight Templar, built on the traditions of the original Knights Templar. The defendant wrote about the meeting with a Serbian war hero before the foundation, and meetings of the Baltic states after the establishment. It appears that the defendant was charged with writing the compendium to unite opposition. The reader of the manifesto will be encouraged to fight their flag. It is written on a level system. The declaration referred to defendant as "Knight Commander Justicious." It means being the leader of a militant cell. In the phase of the civil war we are now, this is the highest degree. [The prosecutor Holden: - Breivik was in and wrote the Manifesto 22 July?] Yes, on page 1750 - conclusion of the Manifesto. Other features of the degree system will be established in a later phase of the ongoing civil war. Under the theme "Communication and logistics," describes more about the organizational and ceremonial aspects of organizations. There are more than 209 pages about the awards and (...). For honors, a distinction is the number of killed traitors. - As we see here some examples: The defendant has used the existing awards and medals used by the Masonic lodge and branches in different countries, and used it in a new importance in the Knights Templar. It also describes various uniforms of Knights Templar and how they should be constructed of uniform parts and how they obtained on the Internet. There are also detailed description of the initiation ritual. [The witness explains how this according to the manifesto to be done and who can and possibly will be there] [Judge Arntzen: - it appears that the proposal from Breivik's side or it appears that an existing system?] - It is evident early on that this, Thus, you give of yourself, there's plenty of information on how to produce things on the internet, how to obtain these medals, how you yourself can put together uniforms. But it is difficult to answer, I will come back a little to it. In the topic "Planning the Operation," writes the defendant on the planning and preparations for a violent operation. The defendant gives the impression that he has spent much time in preparation, which he later wrote down. Information is at such a detailed level, the defendant writes about the cost of marker and color of Kevlar [...].

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Breivik smiles again after Uppheim talking about what Breivik has written about planning, and that he writes that he encourages others to think like a farmer. When Breivik moved to Vålstua farm in April 2011, three months before the terror, he went below deck history to cultivate roots and tubers. Beforehand, he created one-man enterprise Geofarm, among other things, to buy fertilizer.

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- Although this is described as a guide to others, draws all the time the defendant what he has done, the equipment and how he has prepared himself. As here in a

chapter that deals with the importance of self-motivation, type the defendant, and I translate into Norwegian, [reading from the manifesto on how Breivik describes himself and how he motivated himself. Breivik says that he has managed to stay motivated and focused for over nine years] In the theme of "motivation" it says how to motivate and get in physical form, including motivation, Aspiring and use of steroids that the defendant himself admits that he uses or have used. The defendant writes about avoiding mistake from family and friends and to avoid ending up in the spotlight to the Security Service, defendant describes several sequences which cover stories he has taken advantage of when it comes to various acquisitions. It appears that it is important to use cover and give it credibility. Among other things, that if we are to have a firm cover to buy fertilizers, so it is important to behave like a farmer. It also contained about 20 pages of words and phrases that are common in agriculture. As an example, from the manifest include the first to do research and acquire equipment before starting research on weapons. - To avoid the possession of evidence, he writes that he has replaced hard drive between each phase. Utstyret associated with each phase buried in the repository. The defendant also writes in general about how to prioritize targets for an armed action. They are generally formlert and not specifically for Norwegian conditions [quoting from the manifesto] It is not clear which sites defendants have chosen for the crime. Neither ministries or Utøya listed in the manifest. The campaign has not only aims to execute A and B forredre, but also to highlight the movement. It is written not just about preparation, but also about the time after a violent reaction. It appears that one must expect to be demonized and called crazy or a victim. But in 100 years people will understand and they will be revered as heroes. A practical approach. As a counterweight to the police capture pictures will leak to the press, given advice on how to take their own photographs of themselves. A fengeselsopphold described as an opportunity to recruit to political conditions. The defendant described in a separate topic of different forms of attacks, including attacks attacks against party meetings with the flamethrower. He writes about biology and will whip the weapon and take out thoroughly antrax and how this can be distributed traitors by email. It is generally much enumeration in book 3, in different contexts and different themes.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

With regular intervals replace police officers who sit right behind Breivik on his right side to keep guard. The two that have been sitting here since after the break had just guard switch with two others who came in from the back room. This is done almost silently and noticeable.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

The most important thing for the police in connection with the manifesto has been

to extract information that might be interesting in connection with the investigation. It is essentially the Breivik writes about the preparations and the people he had contact with. Much of the manifesto is about ideology and it is the Uppheim now going through the court.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Uppheim lists now up visions of the Manifesto. When he gets to the point about the so-called death factories and surrogati Breivik smiled wide and long. Breivik previously greiet about their thoughts on implementing breeding Norwegians, and organize them into reserves. The first expert, Torgeir Husby and Synne Sørheim, mentioned this in his report that bizarre statements and expressions of delusions.

11:36:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- He writes about and the safeguarding of European genetics, which is threatened by mass immigration. However, points out that only the desire to preserve our genetic uniqueness and that it is not based on Nazi ideas of sovereignty related to race. It is described, numerous proposals for factories using surrogate mothers in low-cost countries. It sketches a future economic model and a new, gender-segregated school system. Reforming of the church is part of the future vision, judgment criteria should be drained only religion in Europe. In a separate topic is included among other Bible verses that legitimate right to self-defense. In a separate topic printer accused of the progress the next stages in the Civil War. It will be possible to recruit personnel from the security, military and police. It appears that the traitors can be granted various degrees of pardoning in phase two. Here we see examples of the policy as traitors to publish. [View on screen] I read it kke up, but I can mention that it also is an oath which is to be read in the initiation ritual of the Knights Templar, and suggestions for opening and closing speech that can be used in a trial. - And there are more chapters that have clean readings. Among other things, oil and gas refinery in various European countries. In other contexts, the list of parties and organizations that are critical of immigration and how weapons can be obtained from criminal organizations. Of the criminal organizations that are listed are motorcycle clubs and the Russian mafia. The defendant is talking about making explosives and have spent much time on google and the recipes he has cut out from the net. He writes of laboratory equipment and instructions on how to create hollow-pointed ammunition suitable because of the damage it causes. He also writes about the ammunition with poison. It appears that he has not tried to make myself. Included is the pure nicotine and nicotine overdose death during described as very painful. It appears that the defendant is

ordered pure nicotine from China, and negative and positive use of nuclear weapons where the reactors are listed in various European countries. And the possibility of spreading the radiation of radioactive waste, where the Eiffel Tower stands out as a suitable target. - The third category of attacks that we see on the screen, defined as large-scale attacks against Muslims with the intention to lead them to the collective jihad. It is for me a little unclear what the defendant wants to convey with regard to attacks on Muslims. In some parts discourages defendants to expend energy on attacks against Muslims, while in other parts calling for it to lead them to the collective jihad. There is also a lot of space to encourage a shift in culture to include the medieval ideals. Japan and South Korea emphasized on several occasions because they have managed to preserve their culture. There are several examples that deal with lack of sexual morality.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Day Uppheim lost the thread of her speech because the presentation apparently does not match the utprintedede version that was handed out to participants.

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- Now there is some clutter in my presentation ... [Pause] It looks like it is missing a part, but I go on. The defendant wrote about how various conservative forces in Europe may gather for a common goal. I can not see that other researchers in the manifesto refers to the direction in mind. We are talking about various right-wing ideologies. Fjord Mann, Robert Spencer and websites such as The Gates of Vienna and The Green Arrow mentioned. To spread the truth within the framework of the Act will constitute 99 percent of the resistance, and create fertile ground for recruitment into armed resistance. [Looking forward for the presentation]. The version that is posted online by someone other than me is different than the version you've been dealt. [Judge Arntzen: - When we take lunch now, at half past one.] Then I regret that there was mess with it. [Judge Arntzen: - There is very good.]

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Since Uppheim came out of it, take right now break until 12:30 pm. Police chief assistant from the PST is not finished with his lecture, so this will continue after the lunch break. Breivik now brought out of the room. During the breaks, he tends to sit in a waiting cell. In parallel VGTV send directly from the court hosted by Mads Andersen and A. Siri Nilminie read. It can follow the route in the top right of this window.

12:32:

Judge Wenche Elizabeth Arntzen:

- As negotiations continue.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

While going through [Dag Uppheim](#) Breivik's interview of himself in the manifesto, note Breivik much. Even defenders Geir Lippestad and Vibeke Hein Bæra notes now. The sakkynidige look straight at the witness stand. Before the break asked Judge Wenche Arntzen questions about the proposals Breivik have listed other terrorists can be considered as suggestions he comes with, or whether there are existing councils. Now answer Uppheim that it is difficult to answer this, but that he believes one can say that it is Breivik's proposal that he believes should be used later in the Civil War he believes will come.

12:43:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- Chapters in book 3 was structured under ... I had come to the various phases of the ongoing civil war. The defendant described including how to make his fortune in a war situation by investing in gold and precious stones. It was written about a coup in France that would spread in Western Europe. The defendant has a practical approach to the topic it appears that it is written that the confrontation was rewarded with one kilogram of gold. In the theme of "further studies" is an interview with a Templar on 76 pages. It appears that the temple knight is the defendant himself. The interview has a number of questions which are accounted for considerations of how the accused will be perceived by society at the time. - What distinguishes today's crusaders from the jihadists. The defendant places himself in the political landscape and describes, what distinguishes him from the Nazis. Section contains text that said the more personal nature. The interview will be personal, such as answering the question of how the defendants were radicalized and, among other things, Serbia-war in 1999 are presented as a personal turning point. He points to the episodes that have helped to increase his political involvement. It's taken a resume that includes everything from political appointments and professional experience. The defendant names and gives personal characteristics of those he considers his closest friends. - There is also a 70-page Knights Templar history in which the accused dates and descriptions of



activities. The history starts in April-May 2002 and 2002-2006 are summarized in short paragraphs and bear no signs of being written in real time. The period 2006-2008 is also very brief, but from the autumn of 2009, it is more frequent and longer log entries, the bulk of the log is about preparing for a violent action, but there are also a number of personal considerations, dealing with unnamed friends and relative utleverage information them. - Over 19 pages in the end is a kind of logging activities in which the defendant describes the preparation of the action, but also more personal activities such as dining and more. So close I was to get in goal when the electronics failed me in the place, I unde emphasizes that this is a topic that is discussed, and there are things I've left out, so it will be in such a short presentation. I am a bit unsure how to evaluate the language all means no. Sequences related medals, gradssystem, formulated in some scenes as if this exists and is a straightforward reference to the places you can get medals. We also know that there are others where it appears clearly that it is etforslag, so I must say that I'm a little unsure of what the defendant intends to convey. - In this a suggestion or exists. It is legal to publish this book is 3 and a couple of chapters in book 2 But it says that this is fiction. It is fiction based on a hypothetical scenario, if the threat continues. I must say, it gets a little subjective, because of the legal disclaimeren, it may be possible that it is written only if the police would be manifest in our hands. [Judge Arntzen: - Thank you so much. Does either party have any questions?] [The prosecutor Holden: - Thank you. This with footnotes, potential map coordinates ... a victim of Utøya do not want to stay at their current address in Liverpool because the coordinates correspond to his address there. Can you say anything about it?] It had an inkling that the question came. In relation to the articles that the defendant has taken from the net, he also brought in its footnotes for reference. These footnotes are the 46 false footnotes, which can not be found among the footnotes in the original articles as they were published on the web. One of these is repeated, so there are 45 different false footnotes.

Comments from VG Marianne bay:

Alongside prosecutors sitting police assessor. Today, Anita Lian who normally works as an investigator on violence section of the Oslo police. She is part of 22 July-unit that was established after the terrorist attacks. Holden wants to know if the footnotes Breivik has used in the manifesto, which at the beginning of the footnote is written koordinatkode. Uppheim says it suggests that this is kartkoodinater to

ten different European cities. At the end of several footnotes are incorporated Cyrillic letters. In 16 cases, the letters that are unique in the Serbian alphabet. Police have received help from experts in encryption, but they have not been able to identify numbers and sequence of letters between the coordinates and the Cyrillic letters. When Uppheim talking about the number and letter sequence in the footnotes that the police have not found out what is, note Breivik much. Earlier today, he has smiled on several occasions, but I can not see that he does now.

12:50:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- common ones is that they can look like web addresses, they are not real and do not do an exact location and everyone has a series of numbers beginning that probably constitutes map coordinates. If they read the map coordinates hit the ten different cities in Western European countries. It is hard to imagine being random. Because of too few digits for precise positioning, they form a rectangle of 110 meters east-west and 55 meters north-south. The alleged map coordinates included a letter and number that does not make sense for us. The false coordinates ends with Cyrillic letters. They are found in the Serbian Cyrillic alphabet. They also have letters that are unique in the Serbian language. It is included in 16 of the incorrect footnotes. To summarize: when it comes to the coordinates as they appear as if it's map coordinates that lead to ten cities in Western European countries. The other letters and numbers makes no sense. - We noted early on that the defendant in his resume that is contained in the manifesto, states that he has knowledge of cryptography. It is a knowledge that the investigation has not been able to uncover, but he has written in the CV. I will ask to make a crypto expert assessment of the Manifesto. [Reading from the conclusion of the report on manifesto cryptographic nature. They have not been able to discover what the number and letter ranks matters or in case what they mean.] - It makes no sense for us, the many private companies that have engaged in their own online forum, but I'm not aware of any has managed to gain an understanding of these letters - and rows of numbers contained in these false footnotes. [Holden: - The last thing you said was that we have not been able to find what is in the Serb letters and the coordinates?] If we look from there, so we have no understanding of it. It's done a kryptofaglig assessment, but it's hard for me to know if it makes any sense to him, or if it is just to create fear. it has at least created some awareness of this document. - [Holden: - When is the compendium written?] As I relate to that stated in the document, it is difficult to conclude. He says that he began work in 2006. And as we see that the log I showed the picture of, so it

appears that from 2006 to 2008, he works with the manifest. But there are a lot of text in this manifesto that does not contain references to time. It is not possible to determine when they are written, even though this is written in order from first to last letter. There are a lot of text especially in book three, which is clearly written in parallel with time. But there is also some text which does not contain any form of tidfestbare events. So I think I must conclude that I can not say for sure. The log is more detailed in the autumn of 2009 and there is a marked difference between book one and book two when it comes to character. Book three has a much more violent character than the previous two books. In a sequence I have shown pictures of the 2003 to 2006, we see that he had a plan A to distribute a legitimate version of the compendium, but that he partly because of losses in the stock market failed to distribute a legitimate version. He therefore turns to plan B, which was a violent campaign to promote it.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Police Superintendent Dag Uppheim finish in his post, and defending Geir Lippestad have taken over the questioning. Lippestad will, among other things, the type of warfare Breivik talking about in his manifesto, and what he means by demographic warfare. - In broad terms that we have opened our borders to Muslims taking over our culture. He believes that they have a higher birth rate reinforces this, answer Uppheim, who led the investigation of the manifest.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

Here you can see a graphical overview of how the codes were added [Breivik hit](#). These codes are located in the manifesto was the theme in the media as early as last August. When I wrote this story: [Police believe hidden codes can be "terrorist-PR"](#).

13:00:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- If the change in grades from the first two books of the third indicates that he has begun a legal action is cleansed spukulasjon on my part. I note that Fjord Mans articles mainly first published in 2006 and 2008. Apart from one, it is not later articles published from Fjordman. [The prosecutor Holden: - It was a sufficient answer to the question.] [Defense Lippestad: - When it comes to views on what kind of warfare going on in Europe now has been an issue earlier. You said that the manifesto told us about three waves of warfare, and we are now in the wooden stage, with demographic warfare. What types of war Breivik spoke about in his manifesto and what does demokgrafisk warfare?] We have opened our borders and

the Muslim women have a higher birth rate than ethnic European women.

[Lippestad: - So this is not about the war with conventional weapons to do in the normal sense?] Not as far as I understand. But while there are sequences that describe the drug sales as a consequence of several Muslims. Muslims are described as evil and those who appear quiet is really just dormant cells, because they are waiting to get into a styrkepositjon. Some concepts in book 1, that it is permissible for a Muslim to lie to an infidel, and renounce their faith to protect itself ... [Lippestad: - But the war that I understand that we are now in, is more of a demographic and mental war between two cultures?] Yes, much of which is not outlined by Breivik. In book 1 and 2 have Breivik written very little. However, it is composed of Breivik. I have used a senior adviser in the PST to summarize the documents. It outlined a conspiracy between the European authorities. - [Defense Lippestad: - Is there any clue in the manifesto that he believes there is a conventional civil war?] No, it made a distinction between what is with weapons and what today is a demographic warfare. [Judge Arntzen: - Can I interject an extension of it, can you explain what is in phase one?] It is argued that dialogue is futile and it will be impossible to reach. And he argues that they will be ridiculed by the politically correct media. The gray from 55 to 99, that I take as a sign of the NATO action in Serbia started, and finally put an end to dialogue. [Judge Arntzen: - So it says "open source warfare," what do you think that?] It is to see the shock attack by secret self-propelled cells that do not have contact with each other, and are not vulnerable. [The judge ask enough questions about the manifesto] He describes how an action like this will help to spread the word, and that truth is hidden from the people to open their eyes to the people and unite in a resistance struggle. The truth manifesto represents.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Lippestad also ask questions about the language manifesto written in - English, starting with asking the Day Uppheim is good in English. He says that he is not particularly good, but that there have been literate in English who have undergone it. These småspørsmålene leading to the main question: - Have you found a word or phrase that has meaning? It denies Uppheim. Such questions are important to ask for Lippestad in light of the issue of tilrengnelighet. Armed Forces are fighting as we know that Brevik be judged criminally sane.

13:04:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- [Holden - I can throw me in and interject a question. I noticed your response to conventional war or not. The second bullet point there, with this "shock attacks",

how would you rate it against conventional war?] Thus, it's a "shock attack" absolutely. But it described not necessarily mean that there is today, it's not a conventional war between Islam and Europe in Europe, but it is ... Yes, it's a bit difficult to understand always what he means. [Lippestad: - But that's the way that what he has done is an example of such a "shock attack"?] Yes, that way I perceive it. [Lippestad: - You said that in any part of part 3, he had been rewritten or added some other concepts in the articles than the original writer had done. Among other things, he is American. Are there examples of "Fjord Manns' texts?"] Not as far as I know. - She who has summarized Fjord Mans articles wrote in his report that one must take into account that they look similar, but there may be changes. We are not very easy word for word for word. We have not done [Lippestad: - Are you aware if there were, we heard about the name on the manifest. Are you aware of a has been no working titles previously, with a different name?] I've only interacted with information in the manifest, and where I can not remember it being shown a different name. - [Lippestad: - I assume you are good in English?] Not specifically. [Lippestad: - Have you received help from someone knowledgeable in English?] Yes, I sat for the most part in meetings of the city, and then, when it was needed to explain certain issues, so I got help. But I am able to read it, I use the dictionary frequently. [Lippestad: My question is if you find words, phrases that you think does not exist, you have met on many such issues?] No, we have looked at what he writes and says about his movements, we are investigators. I am here today because the prosecutor wants it. [Lippestad: - But there has been an issue that there are many strange words and expressions which?] No, not really, but some, for example, he writes about the hundred most multicultural parties, there is a new word for me. But it is more a description than an explanation [Lippestad: You said something about how Breivik has described himself justisciar.] Justicia, yes [Lippestad: - Justicia, Knights Commander. It was to lead a solo cell or that it was self-appointed?] I think it was either a solo cell or more. [Lippestad: - Or more, yes, but there are some places in the manifesto in which he describes himself as a historically great person, a king or what we might call historical greats, that you remember?] Not that I can think of exactly when respect him, but there are sequences that in a hundred years we will be understood and revered as heroes and pioneers, but not particularly tied to his person, I am going on the road. [Lippestad: - No, thank you.]

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Earlier today Breivik twisted somewhat in his chair, leaned back and tilted. Now he sits very quiet and notes very much. The first legal expert team, Synne Sørheim and Torgeir Husby, sits and chats a little with each other while coordinating counsel Frode Elgesem question. Geir Lippestad take the word and says Breivik wish to comment, and that he wishes that the witness remain in the hall while he

speak. Arntzen says it is okay.

Comment from Dennis VG Ravndal:

- It is important to get to, is that it is written twice in the beginning of the lecture notes that there is a draft, says Breivik. An important question that is asked is who the target audience for the compendium. The answer is that this is not meant for the man in the street, but the militant nationalists and those who sympathize with us, he adds.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Wenche Arntzen requested in advance only to comment on the Day Uppheim have said, and not the other. He gets the opportunity later. Breivik talking in a calm tone of voice, and moving much at all. He keeps his eyes fixed on the judge Arntzen those times when he looks up. Mostly, he looks down at his paper that he has frequently quoted on throughout the day. All four experts have turned to Breivik and study him carefully when he speaks. The hall is silent.

13:16:

Witness Dag Uppheim, police superintendent PST:

- [Assistance Attorney Elgesem: - There are a few questions from the coordinating aid lawyers. Back to the first two parts. Was it investigated whether it is his own work, or it may originate from other sources that are not credited?] Something I feel confident that his work is, the description of A and B forrædre. However, other parts can be rewritten from others. We have not gone into what parts of the sentence he has written himself. [Elgesem: - The creation of KT. It describes a trip to Liberia. Is there also some tangible opplysniger otherwise KT has done, such as other terrorist acts that KT was responsible?] It should be speculation about a theft can be committed by a Swedish sister cell. But this is depreciated later. [Elgesem: - Breivik's concerned that it has committed a series of terrorist attacks. Later we will probably get an overview of this. But there is nothing in the manifesto that connects it to KT?] No, it is described as cells without contact [Elgesem: - Breivik describes this as a pompous presentation. Is it compatible with what's in the manifesto? A description of the knights and the purpose of the organization?] It is clear that there is a lot of time to outline a degree system, tombstones, initiation rituals and so on. Each cell guides guides to how this can be done. [Elgesem: - It may be compatible with the text in the document that this is the future and do not exist today?] Yes. [Elgesem: - Is there any correlation between the coordinates in the footnotes hit in Europe?] I'll be a little foriktig the Oslo Police have seen a pattern. We have not. [Elgesem: - The group of victims of terrorist acts Breivik is

large and varied, ranging from casual passers-by to young AUF members Utøya and employees of the government quarter. Have you seen his hit on the definitions in relation to who he actually hit?]

Comment from Dennis VG Ravndal:

- I have not rewritten any items, but have replaced words as used on American words that are easier to understand in Europe, says Breivik. He also says that he has done previously, that the original title was "In Praise of a new Knighthood." Breivik said that they kryptografete tags in the manifest can not be understood without an encoding scheme.

13:17:

Witness Dag Upheim, police superintendent PST:

- He had written something about it. He describes a system and it becomes difficult to interpret what he means, but based his categorization of children Utøya, it can not be categorized as A - and B-traitors based on the manifest. [Lawyer Elgesem: - He writes that the B-traitors are politicians and EU parliamentarians. It qualifies as for certain actions that the author thinks] It appears to eight charges of belonging to the point where it outlined specific accusations. The crime is formulated as a forbyttelse or indictment. It is not always easy to conclude what he meant. [Defense Lippestad: - The request here is whether the defendant can take his comments as the expert witness is here. [Judge Arntzen: - Yes, I think that's okay] - [Judge Arntzen: - I think this is a good idea. I only have one question. Appears in the manifest if it is a finished work or if it is unfinished?] As noted in the introduction, it is described as a good product, but he also encourages others to continue to write on it, and he also takes Subject to the English language. And in two chapters, it appears that these chapters are not finished, but only two chapters totaling 16 pages. [Judge Arntzen: - Okay. I ask you to stand in the witness box, in case you have some answers to Breivik comments.] [Breivik will give their comments.]

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

After Breivik was finished reading up on their comments, he drank the glass of water he has in front of him. Day Upheim said he had nothing to add, and the comments triggered no questions from participants.

Comment from Dennis Ravndal VG:

A new police witness has taken place in the auditorium. The police captain Vidar Saether from the NCIS. He will talk about the investigation of the Knights Templar.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

Police investigating Knights Templar have dealt with Anders Breivik Behring's manifesto and his explanations of why Knights Templar were created, and how and why Breivik was recruited, the network's size and organization of meetings in London and the Baltics.

Comment from Dennis VG Ravndal:

Saether begins by reading from the emergency Amta lean to Breivik, where he presents himself as commander of the Knights Templar Europe.

13:21:

Behring Anders Breivik:

- It is very important to get to is that in the introduction to the compendium is written on two occasions that this is a draft, and this is something the witness can confirm, the word used is "draft" , which is the draft in Norwegian, and I recommend others to further develop it, it's a starting point. Then there's another important question that is not taken, who is the compendium intended. Who is your target audience, the man in the street or the other. - And the answer is that it is not meant for the man in the street, but the militant nationalists and sympathizers of militant nationalists. There are those who are in the gray area to tip over, there are those it is meant for and it is a relatively small group. And when it came to so-called peaceful Muslims, I mean not everyone is sleeping cells, but I have written kompendiet us, we will largely be dominated by orthodox Muslims for a so-called secular Muslim has no influence on the development of Islam. There is also something that can be confirmed by the compendium. And I have not rewritten any items, such as it was an essay from [...] that was on the four sides, 0.2 percent of the compendium, I would have replaced an American word that was quite incomprehensible to Europeans, with a that was easier to understand, I have done several times. The working title until 2008, as I have said in the interview, was "In Praise of the knighthoodog knew it was in 2008 that I changed the title to the European Declaration of Independence. And as I said earlier, I have written about 40 percent of the compendium itself. And the last point in the interrogation, I told about the coordinates of the [...] it must have a coordinating encoding scheme I have spoken to the police in the beginning. Witness Dag Upheim, Police Superintendent PST:

- [Judge Arntzen: - In front of the lines that further comments from your side?] No,

not really, if there are ambiguities in this. [Judge Arntzen: - Thank you.] [Witness Day Uppheim leave the courtroom.] [Next witnessed police captain Vidar Saether from the NCIS takes the witness stand and presents vitneed.] [The prosecutor Engh: - You've made a presentation of what Breivik describes as Knights Templar. Then you can begin.]

13:22:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

Vidar Saether - For the introduction. I'm on NCIS in an analysis group at the tactical department. After the first phase had gone to bed early, I asked to see the Knights Templar and what he has written about it and explained it in interviews. Initially, I will return to the second call that Breivik called the police on 22 July, which was played in court during Holden's keynote speech.



Comments from VG Jarle Brenna

Breivik has, according to him, was a sleeper cell since he was ordained under the Knights Templar in London 1 May 2002. A prerequisite for Breivik could attend the London meeting was alleged that he assumed this had to travel to Liberia to meet a Serbian war hero.

Comment from Dennis Ravndal VG:

One of the main objectives of this investigation team has been to determine whether the organization actually exists, and who may have been the other members. They have not been able to prove.

Comment by Marianne Vika VG:

Like the other police witnesses earlier today, has also Vidar Saether an electronic presentation that he shows on canvas seats in the auditorium. The experts have now set back facing the witness stand. They did after Breivik was finished reading your comments before witnessed the change. Breivik sit up straight and look at the canvas he has ahead of him. Sometimes he drinks from his water glass.

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- When he came through for the first time. Breivik calls and says the operation is carried out and that he wants to surrender. He says that he belongs to "Knights Templar Europe." "I have just performed an operation on behalf of the Knights Templar Norway and Europe." Then it became a goal in relation to that, he says he

belongs to a named organization, to determine whether there is a European organization called the Knights Templar and that he performed an operation on behalf of the organization. We have only Breivik his explanations to assume. So what's in the manifesto and his explanations, subjective information. In the manifesto, as he describes also how he came into contact with the organization and how he was chosen.

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent KRIPOS:

- From the manifesto page 1639 and 1640 [Reading from the manifesto on how Breivik says that he came in contact with other minded and he said that they were skeptical of him]. Here he says that he came in contact with those who established the organization through the internet, and he has scheduled a half years ahead of the establishment meeting in London. Furthermore, it is said that there was an evaluation of him in advance, and this with background check and that he was chosen by many, he says several hundred in Europe. - [Continues to read from the manifest if it Breivik said the meeting with the other Knights Templar members in London, including one that previously must have lived in Liberia.] our task is to find out if there is information that is verifiable. And from his description of an ERD organisasjonen not many places we can do it and see it in context with other objective information and subjective information, that testimony. But he says that it conducted a background check in 2002, and we must look at what information there is about him in 2002. Furthermore, it travels, it's the only thing he has given us the information that we can verify. He also tells of a Serb and that he was the envoy of the Serb establishments. He also said that there was a subsequent meeting of the Baltic States.

Comment from Dennis Ravndal VG:

The police have carefully examined Breivik's movements in 2002, when he should have met a Serbian war hero in Liberia. Breivik claims he traveled to Britain where the organization was founded. They also examined his movements in the Baltics, where he claims that there were two subsequent meetings. To verify a this, the police under scrutiny Breivik's bank details and checked his travels abroad.

Comments from VG Jarle Brenna:

** Breivik has changed the explanation from the Knights Templar recruits extremely talented individuals, who were not in the "intelligence agency data bases," that they recruited Breivik by chance. Breivik has changed ** explanation from the Knights Templar was a pan-European organization with at least 25-30 members to be a network consisting of six persons. Breivik ** had economic motives for their trips to Liberia, Lithuania and Estonia. At the same time it can not be refuted that Breivik may have met a Serb in Liberia, three people in London

in 2002 and people in Lithuania and Estonia in 2004.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

While Sæther tells what the main points of their investigation of the Knights Templar is, Breivik continues to write. He alternates frequently by looking at lerrettet and take notes. It may thus appear as if he writes down these bullet points. Saether took a short break to go to the bench where the prosecution is to pick up water. Typically there is a water carafe and glass in the witness box, but it did apparently not now.

Comment from Dennis VG Ravndal:

Police chief assistant are now reviewing some historical facts about the bombing of Serbia in 1999, and Norway's role in this conflict. Under questioning by prosecutor Breivik put him firmly on the question of the Progress Party's attitude to the bombing, which Breivik said that he was strongly opposed and which was causative of his political involvement. Progress Party supported this bombing NATO auspices. It did not Breivik. - When the bombing started, Breivik at a police training under the auspices of FpU, Sæther says.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

terrorist smiles broadly when Sæther reads his interrogation of 31 last August in which he explains about why he was elected Knight Templars. Among other things, Breivik said that he "was in many respects a multi-talented back then" (in 2002 journalist. Note).

13:34:

Witness Vidar Saether, Police Superintendent NCIS:

- This is what we have as a starting point to examine his explanation. In his further presentation, I have four issues that I should concentrate on, which is important for the creation of KT and if we can say whether it exists or not. The reason for the Kosovo conflict for the establishment of the Knights Templar and Breivik in 2002. Why Breivik were selected. Trips to Liberia and Stobritannia. Trips to Baltics (Lituaen and Estonia). We start with Kosobokonflikten. It started 24 March 1999. Prior to this there had been (...) Norway had a role as a NATO member, but we also had the chairmanship of the OSCE. We also had a diplomatic framework for the conflict. The observers pulled out 24 March and the bombing began shortly afterwards. Then the politician Breivik School 1 in the Progress Party. How active he was, there are different messages. But he went on a course that went over four nights, four hours each session. In the manifesto he mentions Kosovo conflict.

[Quote from the manifesto] This is a personal reason for him that he was involved in the fight. The 23 August, why KT was established is that (referring to Bondevik and Vollvik roles during the bombing of Kosovo). For him personally, from an interview 1 March [read the interview where Breivik said that the bombing of Kosovo was the drop that made the cup to overflowing for Breivik.] In court earlier said Breivik that the bombing of Kosovo was probably more important for other people's involvement.

Comment from Dennis VG Ravndal:

Sæther is now the police assessment of why precisely Breivik said to have been selected to be a member of the Knights Templar. He describes potential members as very intelligent people who are not registered in the databases to European security services. He even claims that the Knights Templar did a background check of him before the meeting in Liberia. - In 2002, Breivik worked as a telemarketer after having dropped out of high school. He had not completed military service. He had the office of the lokallagsleder FpU and was fined for tagging, Sæther says.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Sæther During presentation of the investigation of the Knight Templars alternates the five judges to look at him and looking at the paperwork they have on the table before him. Beforehand, all participants received a printout of your presentation so that they can follow there as well. In addition, it appears the three canvas seats here do not.

Comment from Dennis VG Ravndal:

- If we assume that the bombing in 1999 was decisive for the establishment of the Knights Templar. This was something the party Breivik was a member supported. This speaks not to the benefit of Breivik's a Serbian war hero, says Sæther.

13:40:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- What we will see later is that this may have been somewhat contradictory to his political activities. What's on in the manifesto is a "screening and background check." [Sæther references from interviews made shortly after the attack on Utøya and government districts and later in August. There, Breivik explained that the organization Knights Templar as the focus is on extremely gifted individuals who are intelligent and that he has good persuasion and was very results-oriented in relation to rhetorical approaches. He also said that he could infiltrate any organization outside the Muslim] It is a little explanation of why he was chosen and

based on his resume. So the pompous presentation in relation to what he says in the manifesto and what he has said in interviews. [Sæther does not start with the latest interviews and what Breivik said during the trial] It's the way it appeared to us in the autumn of last year. Settled to see who Breivik was in 2002, so he does not completed high school and worked as a telemarketer for several years and started three companies, all with deficit and he has had two councilors. Criminal Registry is that he is fined for graffiti in 1995. [Sæther also mentions a relationship]

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Breivik leans back in his chair and follows with interest the Sæther shows timeline analysis group in 22 July-unit has made. It showed what positions and what Breivik worked with when he traveled to Liberia. It is this journey which is now subject.

Comment from Dennis VG Ravndal:

Police found receipts for the purchase of a magnifying glass and equipment to assess the diamonds before he traveled to Liberia. They also found phone bills showing calls made to businesses engaged in diamonds. VG has written about Liberia-trip and the unanswered questions, which you can [read here](#).

13:44:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- A question then becomes how can someone overseas do a background check on a Norwegian citizen, what resources they have to implement it. Same to check if someone is not flagged in the "intelligence databases" as it was described at the beginning and does not belong to extremist organizations. Apart from just that, there has been the ability to scan people without police clearance, there was at least looking at the purpose of the compatibility of what was Breivik background. And then we see as the Breivik's party affiliation, according to the Progress Party has always had a strong relationship with NATO, and in connection with the Kosovo war was that position that Kosovo should become an independent state. - The assessment, when a Serbian war hero should have access to the kind of information is a bit contradictory as to whether he should be elected. It may not have spoken in his favor, as we see it. Then we go on to travel. Alf Claus was on this that we compare the subjective statements of objective information. the kind of access to information is much greater in the first months before the terrorist actions, and will then decline gradually. This is partly because we do not have the opportunity to continue to gather research tracks because of, among other storage. When we begin to collect information abroad, then it becomes difficult to verify what he has

said about what happened in other countries, the amount of information flow is more limited. - Liberia trip and the London trip, we have dated from the 16th April to 3 of May. He had taken on board in Progress Majorstua, and in January 2002 put on his position as vice chairman of the FPU Oslo West and go on to become the director in the fall. Diplomaservices.com's not until sluttten of 2002, I make a small correction on the date size of the presentation, he bought the domain 17.11.2002. Breivik testified that he traveled to Liberia at the time, and that there is civil war. In connection with the seizure is found a receipt, which is dated in advance of travel 18 March, the purchase of two diamonds, a lens and a magnifying glass. [Arntzen: - When did you verified that he had traveled to Liberia and London at these times?] We were quite early hold of his passport, which showed that he had been in Liberia for the times. London was a bit more difficult to find, I will come back to, but that he had been in Africa, so we are pretty early. The two diamonds are found at home Breivik.

Comment from Dennis Ravndal VG:

The police have found phone bills until the travel company he used in Liberia, but they had no idea of what kind of hotel he may have stayed at. The archives were destroyed. Police believe that Breivik arrived in Liberia 18 April, but know little about what he was doing while he was there. - Two days later, he stamps the passport back to travel to Ivory Coast. He takes out more money. 20. april he's back again, and is there until the 28th april. Sæther says. Based on receipt of a Mont Blanc pen, according to the police that he must have taken a flight from Nairobi to Heathrow 30 april.

13:51:

Witness Vidar Saether, Police Superintendent NCIS:

- We also found specific phone bills, from the time period April to October 2002. This is a phone in Marie Street [VG choose not to enter the number in the street], where Breivik lived. The list is found phone calls that we can relate to the journey. 5. and 18 March, we find calls to 12 different business affiliations that relate to travel and telemarketing. We also see that he is calling for travel companies abroad that have something to do with Liberia travel. 4.4 he calls a diamond shop in London, engaged in diamond cutting and grinding. 5.4 calls the Freestyle Travel in Oslo, and then calls the Travel Clinic. We see that he transfers to these companies. The company was dissolved in 2003 and we have not succeeded to obtain the order Breivik did then. We have extracted the records showing that he took the vaccines at the Travel Clinic. (...) It coincides with our perception of when he should have gone. 15.4 he calls again to Diamond House, and another

business in the same street in London. British police have been in contact with these businesses and say that it is not uncommon that people contact them and offer rough diamonds from Africa. Most of the offers they refuse, because providers have insufficient knowledge of diamonds and the quality is not good enough. They have not had any customer relationship Breivik. The same day he also calls a travel agency in Liberia. But we had no information about Breivik in their records. All information is deleted after five years in their records. The last thing we see in Norway is that he is on the National Theatre and the Stock Street at the airport abroad. For these transactions, we have not the supplements. And we see that he has been on the Liberian embassy in Ivory Coast.

13:54:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- judging from travel journals for travel clinic is the sannsynmlig that he left on 16 and the Ivory Coast on 17 april. The 18 april we see him take out the money in local currency in the Ivory Coast. The same day, we see there is a visa stamp at Roberts International Airport in Liberia. We know very little what he did besides his own testimony in Liberia. We have not been able to find objective information. Then Breivik, according to him have been "training course". It was from the first part of the trip to Liberia where he was twice. He stamps that is out again two days after the 18th april. He has two outlets in just over 10,000 dollars in Ivory Coast, he has explained that he had with the euro down and had to exchange them for dollars. He returns to Liberia the second time on 22 and is there until the 28th april. As I said earlier, we do not order with travel company so we did not order or how he got down until we found a receipt dated the 30th april. When it is paid for a Mont Blanc pen for \$ 130 on a plane to London and he landed there in the morning.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

The police have recently found that Breivik returned from Liberia 30 april 2002 because he bought a Mount Blanc pen on the plane, that the land in Nairobi, Kenya. According to the flight he landed in London early in the morning of 30 april. These days are very controversial, since Breivik has always maintained that the alleged ordineringsmøtet the Knights Templar took place in London 1 of May. Besides the two transactions in two different cafes or pubs in the UK 3 May, police have not found traces of him. Since these are chains, police have not figured out where in London it is. Police have found traces of the Breivik returned to Norway with the last plane 3 of May.

13:55:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- When we have over to what he says even happen, because we must to London. There were two meetings where Breivik then met with three people, and it will then be another meeting where Breivik met four people. Then there were three people who did not. Breivik was substitute for one of them. If screening was performed on all who participated, I had this organization had the capacity to intelligence in 11 different countries. So look Breivik only on the three he met as part of the organization. At that meeting, he has thus described some content on it: "I was the youngest one there [...] I believe I scribbled down 50 pages of information, some of Which are enclosed in the book. [...] I could not fully comprehend how lucky I was to be in the same room with some of the world's best military strategicians. [...] Some of us were really Unfamiliar with Each Other before hand, so I guess we all took a great risk meeting face to face. "

Comment from Dennis Ravndal VG:

The Manifesto Breivik writes that his plan for the inaugural meeting was to serve 30 million. Police have gone through paypal-his history and found that he has purchased equipment to measure and weigh diamonds. - He is purchasing several items that can be linked to diamonds, Sæther says.

13:58:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- While Breivik says he has a magnificent presentation, he says that everything in the manifest is true. It is a little difficult to deal with, but we see that here he portrays the members that they have properties that are a bit distinct, they are politicians and military characteristics. This receipt, we have found recently, but in connection with his account information so we got confirmation that he has had two transactions in England 3 of May. [Eng: - Are there cafes, or both?] The one we think is a pub, and the other, we know that is a chain, we do not know where in London it is. We see that the next transaction is in Norway, we have seen on the login history on Skandia bank, the night 3 - 4 And the last plane to land in Norway, the night 3 Therefore, we are reasonably confident that he landed in Norway 3 of May. So we are over what happened after the journey. Then Breivik explained that he had a plan A, he would serve 30 million. - [Arntzen: - You said he came to Britain 30 May? So he was there from the 30th to 3 ?] Yes, that's right. He will serve 30 million to build an NGO. What we find then is that he has a transaction to a

business in the U.S., we have found the information in the Pay Pal that it was a spektoskop and a diamond weight. we have ikke indulgent in seizures, but I have seen whatever it is, and has found on the internet. This is a spektoskop to determine light in diamonds, diamond weight, diamond weight is a measure. The 14th and 15 May as he calls Diamond Institute in the U.S., and have a transaction of 20 USD, which we do not know what is. He is purchasing several items that can be related to diamonds, after the journey. The 21 May will switch him in, he is selling dollars, and get into their accounts a little over 30,000 million.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

While Sæther says Breivik on purchases made by Liberia-journey, several procurement relating to diamonds, leaning against the accused defends Vibeke Hein Bæra and chatting with her.

14:06:

Witness Vidar Saether, Police Superintendent NCIS:

- We have a good idea to secure a debate forum FrPU from their side, in part. We have found 231 posts that are related to Breivik. But we have only managed to secure over 200 of these. This post is a week after he had contacted the (...) and got over a little over 30,000 dollars on his account. This may help to shed light on his political activity and opinions at the time. It shows how he worded himself and which topic he takes up. Dated 23 May: [reading from the message board]. If you think back to three weeks tidliere, there has been a etabnlingsmøte of Knights Templar. One of the reasons for establishing the Kosovo conflict. Three weeks after he came home from that meeting, he suggests a humanistic platform. The next day he buys a subscription to a journal for rough diamonds from South Africa. The same day, 27 and 28 May he calls City Bank in the U.S. and the UK. [Indicates that a phone call to a person in Monrovia, Liberia.] The way Liberian police had found out this was that the number was still in use in Liberia, who had received it from another person. He said the person he had gotten the number from now lived in the U.S.. [Eng: - Yesterday, the defendant told the friend that he had contributed 10,000 dollars to the possible purchase of diamonds in Liberia. Do you know the date of the transfer?] Yes, I get to that shortly.

Comment from Dennis VG Ravndal:

24 May 2002 buy Breivik a price list of rough diamonds. He calls that a man named Alpha Kallon, who AP wrote about yesterday. Breivik's best friend testified yesterday that people Breivik met in Liberia nagged at him for doing business, but that Breivik had not received any diamonds when he was there. Over the next two

weeks he was transferring around 40,000 kroner to Kallon. In his keynote speech suggested that the District Attorney Holden Breivik may have been fooled by so-called Nigerian scammers. Breivik denies this though, and says that the diamond scheme was only a smoke screen to fool friends.

14:10:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- For the 31 May is a transfer from Citibank in New York at 500 dollars - nearly 4,000 dollars - to Liberia. A little over a week after he transferred to Liberia, he has a new post on the discussion forum, where he discusses capitalism with a forum debater. I will start in the middle of the post: "Otherwise, I respond that the Socialists condemn capitalists. I am an entrepreneur and the capitalist who works rævva of me and put my resources into the one project. There is a risk I take, and I run the risk of bankruptcy and nervous breakdown ... " - "Now it's also true that I want to work hard and sacrifice taxation, security, etc., to be rich and live the rest of your life without financial worries . The risk I take, but I do not accept that people who see me in my possible future Ferrari will call me cynical, people who probably indirectly stolen from the poor [...] "This must also be seen in the context of his plan A as is to serve 30 million to start an NGO. Five days later then comes the second transaction to Alpha Kallon at \$ 4,400. And when we come to it with NN and 10,000 respectively. Two days earlier, is it 10,000 from the NN to Breivik, who then go on to the same person in Liberia. The same day there are two phone calls to Alpha Kallon. Then there are the 19 and 21.6 calls for a travel company in Liberia. It can help to support the accused himself has said that he will be traveling to Liberia. The last post I should have with a Breivik has written himself.

Comment from Dennis Ravndal VG:

In a post on Fpus old web forum, Breivik writes that nationalism is a disease in Europe. This takes place three months after he had been in Liberia, where he allegedly convinced militant nationalist. - It seems we are weird, Sæther says. Police Superintendent Vidar Saether said that the police are still looking for Alpha Kallon, who, according to Liberian police may stay in the United States. - We have an expired passport that belonged to him, and make steps to find him, Sæther says. If the police get hold of him, they can identify Breivik's movements in Liberia. It will be able to confirm or deny the story about the meeting with the Serb.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Sæther says they have identified the Alpha Kallon, who transferred the money to

Breivik. They did this by Liberian police identified the number Breivik called and came in contact with a family member of Kallon. 18. May this year we were told by police that they have not received a response from the letters rogatory to Liberia, so when they found the answer to this is unclear. Police have not questioned Kallon.

14:16:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- [Sæther reading from the manifesto, which Breivik writes about the comparison of Europe and the United States, and that has meant that Europe is weaker and more inconsistent than the United States. He thinks we have much to learn from the Americans, and that poor countries hate and resent the United States, particularly countries with many Muslims. It says that everyone knows that the U.S. is not trying to hide their motives, and that rational selfishness leads to development.] There are several things here that we notice, the first is that Europe has a serious illness, as he mentions nationalism. We are not quite in context, but that's what he stands for. This is when a little over two months after ordineringsmøtet in London. Then it is our view basis to inquire about when the war Serbia was important from Breivik, if it actually happened after ordineringsmøtet. - I look contradictory at first what he says about the Kosovo conflict and in his ideology today. At the same time we are not in the course of the 101 posts we have ensured that he has mentioned Kosovo conflict or crisis in the Balkans again. 28. June will call him, and the last thing we see in connection with Liberia is that he calls a Travel service. I have been in contact with the Liberian police to find who has detet number, and he has got this issue of the Alpha-in-law Kalon, who says he ahr got this from Alpha Kallon. [Arntzen: - But what Alpha Kallon doing, is not known] We have a copy of a passport from him. It is perhaps a little vague and not so easy to see on the screen, but if we look at all the transactions that we see in the context of the journey, both what he has paid, how much contact he has with him, withdrawals in the Ivory Coast and how much he use of related articles that can relateresl of diamante, we get a sum of 114,000 crowns.

14:20:

Witness Vidar Saether, Police Superintendent NCIS:

- If we make the purchase he made in advance of travel, the total around 84,000 kroner in the context of Liberia and the United Kingdom. 10,000 of these is when

his friend's money. It is then assumed that he used on the trip the euro and the dollar he bought. To give these numbers some meaning, we have looked at his available funds. Prior to the journey he had around 100,000 kroner. After the journey, when he just under 30,000 crowns. He received two salaries in the meantime. This gives some insight into what proportion of money spent on the trip to Liberia in relation to his disposable funds. Then we are the past, and that is what he says in connection with the journey to the Baltic. He has worked with graduate service in just over a year and still has offices in FrPU. Breivik have described the Baltic meeting can not be compared with the London meeting, because it was an open meeting with the right wing. Back to the manifesto and what he says about the content of the meetings. [Reading from the manifesto on which countries meet the participants came from.] If we take seriously what he writes, the organization must have had representatives in 15 countries. He writes some detail about what this meeting contained. [Reads the encouragement to spread propaganda and was informed of KT.]

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Sæther While talking about what they have found out about the alleged ordineringsmøtet the Knight Templars, note Breivik much. He has mainly written extensively on the paper he had in front throughout the day. He has asked to comment again, the previous testimony. It is possible that he has any comments on this too.

14:25:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- There are a few things here that we see that among other things, was up to them how they should perform resistance. But they were not asked to represent the organization. I think this is a bit odd in that this is a secret meeting and a secret organization that has existed for nine to ten years. Knights Templar was the theme of the meeting and terrorist acts in which they discuss the frequency of terrorist acts. Here, too, has he described the types of people who were at the meeting. [He refers from Breivik manifesto about these people. The fact that people were successful weeks and in no way was flagged by some authorities] He was [the manifesto] impressed with his organization and the manner of selecting members. So is that what we find on trips. We can find them in his passport. - We find two trips in his passport. And we must remember mast Lithuania and Estonia are the two trips we have seen, he has traveled to. They joined the EU in 2004, but Schengen in '07. Where we have information about who he bought the journeys. At Kilroy, we have found the tickets. We see that he lands in the 2:30 p.m. in

Lithuania. Via account information so it is also found a reservation at a hotel. This hotel is 100 meters from the bank, which we shall return. For we see that he is out of the country again one day later, looked like the gross-time, so is he in the country in 25 hours. Based on the survey done by the economy, so is it found back to his establishment of an account in a Lithuanian bank. At the same time he solved a check on some Nover \$ 20,000.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

Breivik smile enough away when Saether begins with summary points that kills Breivik explanations. They believe in part that defendants had clear economic motives for traveling to the Baltics. He created accounts there, which he later used for money laundering.

Comment from Dennis VG Ravndal:

Breivik said that he attended two meetings of the Baltic States to meet others in the Knights Templar. Police have only found evidence that he was in Lithuania for 25 hours, where he created an account that was used to launder money from the certificate sales. - We are therefore not consistent between the Breivik said the bombing of Serbia and what he writes on the Internet during this period. We also believe that it is strange that he paid over 40,000 dollars on a diamond sale that would be a cover, while this is 10,000 dollars from best friend. Our conclusion is that the Knights Templar is not in the sense Breivik describes, Sæther says.

14:29:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- [Engh: - Has this account been in use for more than that? [Yes, it has subsequently been used. [Engh: - What has become of this money?]] Do you ask almost anyone else. [Mette Yvonne Larsen points out that there is bad air, and ask for pause. Arntzen agree, but let Sæther finish the presentation first.] He travels alone with Kilroy Travels, pay cash and arrival of Finnair's Tallinn at 20:30 on the evening of 28 april. We have no hotel stay for Estonia trip, but we see him depart the next day, at 15.20. He is where nineteen hours. The same here, we find that he created two accounts, one for dollars and one for the Estonian currency and he has with him two checks for \$ 20,000 each, which he put into an account. . - Both accounts have been in use for it. There were only three checks that they have found in their study, the rest of the cash flow has gone online. So to recap, we find no correlation between the conflict's impact, his political activity and what he writes on the forum, especially after the journey. That this should be the straw that cup to overflow, that we do not find that the complies with whom he was in

2002. In terms of who he is as we see that if there should have been carried out a screening, we believe that his political activity would not be to his advantage.

Comments from VG Marianne Vika:

The court pauses for 15 minutes until 14.45.

14:33:

Witness Vidar Saether, Police Superintendent NCIS:

- And so journeys: The question is how much to do to build a cover, even when your best friend spits into 10,000 dollars in the project. Our conclusion is that journeys are financially motivated, with the purpose of making money diamaner. So the Baltics, we think he has a very different motive for going there, namely, to launder approximately half a million crowns. This is the first three accounts, he creates in Europe. This supports our view, that we find no evidence that the Knights Templar do not exist in the form Breivik said. We believe he has other motives for traveling. [Judge Arntzen: - We are now taking a break of fifteen minutes, we'll open for questions.] [The prosecutor Holden: - We have two witnesses again, of course we can put one of them. If we do not, I believe that we must expect 5:00 to 5:30 today.] [Judge Arntzen: - I have to hear the other members of the court. It is not so simple if we keep on until 5:00 to 5:30 each day. Who would then have to defer?] [The prosecutor Holden: - That I could have a reasonable idea after the break. [The prosecutor Arntzen: - Good. Then it's break for each of three.]

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

The defenders should now ask questions to Sæther. Lippestad will confirm that Breivik has actually been in Liberia, London and the baltic states at the times he has explained. It confirms Sæther. The police parties, however, does not trust that Breivik was in London to attend the inaugural meeting of the Knights Templar, and Lippestad will have clarified what the police think about Breiiks explanation of cover stories. Breivik claims he used the story of blood diamonds in Liberia as a cover-up. There are many empty seats in the hall 250 in the day, and the clear majority of audiences are journalists and photographers. Also in the press corps, there are fewer attending today than before the trial.

14:58:

Witness Vidar Saether, Police Superintendent NCIS:

- [Holden prosecutor tells the court that the statement of the theme to the economy caused by an appropriate time, but that there is no more] [Judge Arntzen: - When we open for questions to the witness] [Bejer Engh has no issues now] [Defense Lippestad: - As you probably know, is this question of sitftelsemøtet has taken place of importance.] Lippestad summarizes the investigation has shown that Breivik was in London at some point. He was in Liberia where he says he has been there and get confirmation from the witness Sæther. [Defense Lippestad: - So when any question, I understand that you doubt that he has been in London to take part in the founding of the Knights Templar, you think he has been there to engage in economy and trade of diamonds . When it comes to this with cover stories have you put yourself in the manifesto in which he writes about it and what he thinks about it?] I have not put so much into it and just put me into the Knights Templar. I have recounted it, but can not say exactly what's there now. [Defense Lippestad: - He writes a lot about how he appears to hide it]

14:59:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- Not if it's a completely different section than the Knights Templar, I have not done so. [Lippestad: - Are you familiar with some of the cover stories that he has de facto made, such as why he would rent this house? Yes, it was essential that he could carry, so I understood. Therefore, he said it to their friends. [Lippestad: - You presented your documents the purchase of rough diamonds. How have you considered this receipt? Why would he buy diamonds in Norway before this trip to Liberia?]] - Our opinion is also supported by like NN explained yesterday that he bought a diamond to have knowledge and have the opportunity to evaluate diamonds. [Lippestad: - How do you rate it as a logical thing to do? If the purpose is to buy rough diamonds, so it may be wise to familiarize themselves with how rough diamonds looks and quality. [Lippestad: - But it was just blood diamond he was going to buy?]] Blood Diamond is just an expression. That's the word, for, as I understand it, how it is obtained and not a term for a type of diamond. [Lippestad: - I understand, but I can not see anywhere that it was said he was going to buy rough diamonds in Liberia.] However, in retrospect, he buys a [...] for rough diamonds. - [Lippestad: - What he explains is that he that is over ten years ago at a secret location with people who do not disclose their real names, three of them plus himself, meet to establish what he calls an organization. Has English or Norwegian intelligence opportunity to find out if it happened, that four persons taken place homely and with a secret name to discuss the establishment of an organization ten years ago?] It is difficult, as I said, we have little information about the which took place in London. But we believe that the whole premise of

Liberia trip, that he should have been an ambassador for the Serb, is difficult for us to understand. [Lippestad: - I just try to see what this documentation you have submitted documents, and if intelligence is the case in Norway or England, that you can go ten years back and say that such a meeting has not taken place, then I think that we live in a world where monitoring has come a long way, so I ask you whether it is possible to figure it out.] We can not rule out that he has done, that he has met a person in Liberia is possible also that he has met people who think the same as him in London. But what we have seen is whether this could have been planned in advance.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Lippestad hardtfor argues that monitoring has come a long way if the police can rule out that there was no foundation meeting in London only because they can not document it in retrospect. - Is it possible to find out? He will know the meeting. Sæther admits that they can not rule out that the meeting took place, but maintains that they do not believe in Breivik's story of the founding meeting. Police believe Breivik primarily had economic motives for the trip to Liberia and then London. Lippestad will also know why police have not spoken with Alpha Kallon, who Breivik has sent two money transfers to and had phone conversations. Sæther admits again that the police would like to have talked with him, but that other explanations, including from Breivik former best friend, and another investigation clarifies that Breivik's motive for the trip to Liberia was the establishment of the Knights Templar. - But we would obviously like to talk with him, he said.

15:06:

The witness Vidar Saether, Police Superintendent NCIS:

- [Defense Lippestad: - Have you considered whether he might have had two motives for traveling to Liberia and London, both politically and economically?] The course we have considered, but our view is that his motive was to make money, based on the preparation he did. How secure you want to be sure he had two motives for Liberia-trip, it's up to the court to make an overall assessment of the overall picture. [Breivik smiles.] [Defense Lippestad: - Yes, there will of course right to decide. I just wanted to find out more about the investigation. In London there was one called Richard who was in the same place and time. Do you know which hotel he stayed at?] St. George Hotel. [Defense Lippestad: - How are you, or the police, investigating whether a person named Richard has lived on St. George Hotel?] It was a coincidence. We do not want him to have something to do with this. [Defense Lippestad: - But we are agreed that there was a person there named

Richard, who had contact with Breivik in advance, and who lived at the St. George hotel while Breivik] Yes. [Judge Arntzen: - What nationality is he he?] Norwegian.

Comments from VG's Eve Therese Grøttum:

Lippestad ask a question about e-mail accounts to Breivik, adding that the premise that only 10 of the 31 accounts of Breivik has been identified by police as Breivik and defense team said earlier in the trial. - Defendant, I do not think you should take for granted the premise of the question right, interrupts the prosecutor Svein Holden. He asks Lippestad to be more open to question its position, and receives support from the district court judge Arntzen. - Yes, do not ask questions of the premises which is so uncertain, she said. Lippestad promise to abide by this.

15:10:

Witness Vidar Saether, Police Superintendent NCIS:

- [Defense Lippestad: - We have documentation on this, but it has now been confirmed. He Kallon Alpha, what is done to interrogate him, for he may be able to shed light on the outlet] We have sent a request directly to Liberia. It is not the easiest country to get answers from, but we have gone through the phone numbers and sent a request to identify the person who received the money that should have had an account the money was sent. And when we got to know that answer last week when we have both the transactions and have a phone number that is indirectly related to him. We came to svigerboren that said Kallon in the United States. Then I try to get him. [Defense Lippestad: - Is there a usikkerhetsmonent that you have not questioned him?] Judging from the other information that is presented as it is in relation to what we believe is subject to Breivik, so of course we want to talk to him. But after NNS explanation and procurement and the things that are done prior and after, we believe that it was the diamond trade. But for the matter part we would like to speak with him.

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- [Lippestad: - When was the Letter of Request sent?] I think it went out in December last year. [Lippestad: - This is the investigation to try to determine whether there may be additional. Are you aware that there was a relay in March 2011, where a person warned against a Manifesto which was written and an action against AUF-ers?] Yes. [Lippestad: - Are you familiar with the investigation about to reveal who has been called in?] I have no knowledge of it, the investigation is not related to the Knights Templar, so I'm not the right person to answer that question. [Lippestad: - But in terms of Knights Templar and possible contacts. How many email accounts you have and your looked upon with a view to identify any

contacts?] - This is the second part of the investigation, when I talk about the presentation of Alf Claus. [But it must have been contact between you, I guess. But who Breivik has had contact with the e-mail?] It has been my task. [But are you aware that there are only ten of 30 e-mail accounts are analysed?] [Lippestad, Holden and Arntzen discussing whether this is the witness to give evidence about the e-mail addresses. Arntzen believes Lippestad should formulate the question more open.] [Lippestad: - This has been a center for your investigative research?] I have not had any responsibility there, but if someone had found something interesting there, I had probably learned of it. [Lippestad: - When I have a few questions, you pulled out some things that Breivik had written when he was in FpU.]

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Lippestad have no more questions, but warns that Breivik has comments. First, aid lawyers word. Also coordinating counsel Mette Yvonne Larsen raises questions about the Knights Templar. She wonders how it is possible for the police to conclude that the network does not exist if it is true that there are in encellestrukturer where the individual cells do not know about each other. - We have no evidence that the Knights Templar exist so Breivik explains it, maintains Sæther. - Have you found evidence that there is not then? asks Larsen. - It is a bit like Santa Claus (tidl.politivitne, journalist. Note) said: How can we disprove if things do not exist?

15:21:

Witness Vidar Saether, Police Superintendent NCIS:

- Yes. [Defense Lippestad: - So, how would you rate the current government in Norway? We have a government in Norway, we have a partnership government with the Socialist Left Party and the Labor Party, which supports NATO. Is there anything in today's collaborative government is amiss there?] No, I will not embark me in such an assessment. I point out that the Christian Democratic Party Vollebaek, his three weeks after the coordination meeting of the revolutionary organization, which is apparently going to use violence, proposes to the Board of FPU to cooperate with the parties three weeks earlier, he does not have (...). [Defense Lippestad: - Do you know which party Breivik refers to in his enemy? It is just Labor, he has been working against. [Defense Lippestad: - When I I do not any more questions. Breivik have any comments.] [Referee: - It will take us next.] [Lawyer Larsen: - We have received the so-called KT report. Your conclusion before the break was that the KT network does not exist in the form Breivik explained. How did he explain this?] Both. Both manifest and questioning. [Larsen:

- But the manifesto described unicellular who do not know about each other. Is it possible to you to conclude that the single cell that does not know about each other no?] Our conclusion is that the start was not as Breivik. In relation to the way he has explained journeys and establishment meeting is the only thing we can verify a evidence. We do not believe the motives for these trips. [Larsen: - It is about a choice the police then? Is it true that if there exists a KT-network consisting of cells as described in the manifesto, the police may say something about it?] We can not say that it is these cells. It was a bit like Santa Claus said, How can we disprove if things do not exist? The rest of the investigation has gone to the classical investigations where we've been looking for helpers to Breivik. [Larsen: - Have you considered a magnificent representation of the analysis?] Not really. WE have taken into account that the explanation has changed along the way. But when he says that he explains himself pompously he speaks about the adjectives he uses. [Larsen: - All right, thank you.]

15:26:

Witness Vidar Saether, police superintendent NCIS:

- [prosecutor Bejer Engh: - It has been very much back and forth about Breivik has changed explanation and especially around the Knights Templar. You have gone through interviews with Breivik terms of Knights Templar in court and in interviews. In the case of Breivik's explanation that he met a Serb in Liberia and sent to London as envoy to him, and that he there for a ordineringsmøte got a mandate, and then start writing the compendium which he was assigned to do. Furthermore, he was on the Baltic at camp. Has he ever changed in this core?] No. [The prosecutor Holden: - My question with this "Rickard", which was taken up by the defense and it was mentioned that he was in London in May, and stayed at the hotel in London, so could have thought me more questions if he knows what's wife "Rickard" has told the London-trip] [Judge Arntzen: - As long as we do not mention the name] [Counsel for the prosecution Holden: - There will be some of you suddenly realize I] [The prosecutor says this to the witness] I do not remember. I would point out one thing in relation to the randomness of this, "Rickard" was in London at the same time. 1. May is a holiday and as I see it - a long weekend and it is not unnatural to go away then. [The prosecutor Holden: - We can come back to someone who can give an answer about this couple were apart] [Judge Lyng: - You say it was a long weekend] I wondered also randomness that it was there once, but 1 May is a day off and it goes there a way to check the back room if it was a long weekend or not. [Judge Arntzen have any questions about a phone call Breivik made with a diamond store in London] We have been in contact with these businesses through British police and they have no business relationship with

Breivik, and the other was that they always were called by people who would sell diamonds from Africa. - When it came to this to consider me as a worthy candidate, then I noticed that the police and testified very toned down what were the conditions that I would be considered at all. The main reason was that I had no criminal record and that I had not had any contact with extremist organizations. As it was mentioned that I once drove drunk on a snowmobile. It is not considered a traffic offense even .. Ok, it's perhaps a little more than a traffic offense, but when I talk about the criminal record, so I talk about more serious things than that. So it was mainly that I had not been flagged, and that I had not belonged to any extremist organizations that did it.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

District Court Judge Arntzen want to know if the two telephone conversations between Breivik and a diamond trader in London is checked out. She learns that there was no business relationship between them and Breivik, and that it was not uncommon atble contacted by people who would sell them African diamonds.

15:27:

Behring Anders Breivik:

- When it came to this equipment, and the rough diamonds, it was to support the cover, it really confirms what I have said all along. I spent 1-2 weeks making this cover, and in comparison I spent about a month to create the cover related to Geofarm. Thus, it was a cover. Yes, when it came to the Progress Party's views on the Kosovo conflict, it was actually the party split in the case, even if it went in one retningenss favor, the party was on the far right in Norway, so regardless of what they should think about that it was there really is no alternative. Those who have followed in the political debate knows that both Kleppe and Simonsen, no Hedstrom was put out. And Simonsen was placed in one or another committee. If there are any members who identify themselves as strong attitudes towards immigration, if there is someone who will make careers in the party, they are very reluctant to speak about this at all, I was very aware of the that time. I had run two races for a while, I wanted to see how far I come to the City Council list. - [Judge Arntzen: - Breivik, what have you explained to us before.] When it came to 10,000 from NN. He dealt only with what I told him, and he does not relate to why I was going to Liberia. As a witness even mentioned, not meeting the Baltic compared to the London meeting. 15:31:

Witness Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- [New Witness, [Anette Seip](#) from the NCIS, takes the witness stand] [Judge Arntzen: - There are delays for your explanation, and I apologize.] [Witness oath.] We have had focus on items that were in use 22 July or related to planning the 22 July. It is a work with many details and many investigators have been involved. I just want to that we have not considered the legality of the possession of certain things. -



There I will go through, it is divided into four main parts. That's when the first mandate we have been working under. So I show four main findings. Then, working methods, how we've been working and I can maybe go quickly through. And then finally a group summary, the groups uniform, equipment, weapons - ammunition and bomb. When it comes to mandate that we have Joe as the rest of the investigation focused on whether there can be no helpers. Is there anyone else who may have procured these things, or is the accused who bought it?

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Breivik had several comments to explain the Knights Templar. He stuck to his earlier testimony that he was elected into the network because he had no criminal record and had not expressed extremist attitudes. Police believe he would be a natural candidate if the network actually existed. He also stressed again that bloddiamantene was a cover story that he spent 1-2 weeks in the making, and that he is not necessarily wrong when it came to the Progress Party's views on the conflict in Kosovo. Police believe Breivik's post on the forum FpUs debate shows that he was concerned about completely different things than terrorist attacks and the Kosovo crisis in 2002. Breivik said the party was divided on the question, and begins to talk about how Jan Simonsen and Vidar Kleppe was purged from the party because of innvandringsfiendlighet. Breivik alleges that he stayed away from such attitudes because he would try to make a career. He is then interrupted by Arntzen, who said the court already knew this. Anette Seip explains itself now Breivik procurement.

15:32:

Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- We have also had a focus on trying to continue a fixed date when the defendant went from thought to action. We believe that by looking at specific acquisitions it may say something about this time. Furthermore, we have been involved in efforts to identify Breivik's life. It can provide answers to questions such as why a phone call has taken place. I will show four main findings that we believe the investigation has concluded. The first is that we have identified 112 purchases from 90 vendors in 10 countries. This is 112 purchase that we relate to 22 July. Each of these purchases often contain multiple objects, so the number of objects is far more than 112 We found no relevant purchase before the fall of 2009. [Holden asks questions about his gun.] We know that the rifle was purchased in connection with the fact that he was hunting with friends, more people were looking at the same time.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

More listeners and journalists left the hall before the last witness. District Court Judge Wenche Arntzen expressed concern that the Seip folder of information was very thick, and that she therefore probably not raised at the court within 16 It would also have been a witness today, which is subject of time considerations. police have found that Breivik mostly used his own name, own account and his own address when he ordered items he used to build the bomb, and weapon parts.

15:37:

Witness Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- We will go into the various steps in a procurement process afterwards, but the defendant may be linked to all of these purchases. It is not identified other individuals with an active role in forboindlse with sise purchases. By this we mean that people who have received packages on behalf of Breivik, such as his mother. When it comes to how these purchases are made, we have made some of the main. There is extensive use of the defendant's own name or in combination with the company name. We see the use of separate account, which is either a bank account or a payment service on the internet called Pay Pal. We shall show made the division of payment later. We see that there is active trading online. We also see that there are some scattered buying from many retailers, of different type of character: everything from private individuals on finn.no to larger stores. Where we have information about the delivery of goods, delivery address home address of the defendant. It was delivered either by courier or by postikontor. I thought I'd

show what we have seen in relation to time. We see a timeline from May 2009, the establishment of Geofarm, and it ends in July 2011. The lines illustrate the first and last purchase in each group, and does not indicate the number of purchases.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

The police have divided the purchases between uniforms, equipment, weapons / ammunition and bomb ingredients. All were obtained from 2009 until the attack. Breivik also purchased a shotgun in 2003 that was in the car when he was on Utøya. The police believe that he actually bought because he was hunting with friends, not as a preparation for terror. Breivik spent several online stores to order goods. He used mostly the international network giant e-Bay, but also the purchase over the phone and Norwegian FINN.no. He paid for mostly with paypal account or credit transfer. A few times he paid in cash, by card or through Western Union.

15:41:

Witness Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- Then we have the group with uniform stretching from September 2009 to May 2010. The group with equipment ranging from April 2010 to March 2011. Gurppen weapons amminusjon and weapons parts from May 2010 to June 2011. Furthermore, we have the group that we have already taken, and it's bomb. It is from September 2010 to July 2011. As you can see I have not set up the purchase of the shotgun, which happened in 2003, when this is the procurement that is not related to the action. I have set up a chart in relation to booking. It is based on the identified purchases. The first is eBay, where it made 42 purchases. On the internet has made 18 [The remainder of the e-mail, in store, by telephone and finn.no the chart] If one of the 82 known methods such order is 71 made on the internet. Probably there are more, but we do not have information on all orders. - It's set up a similar list of payment methods. Here is the same system and under here, it says, "pp" is PayPal, the U.S. payment service that is associated closely with eBay. At the same time as we see here that the total of 106 payments, it is 90 that is linked to the account. [Going further through the payment methods used. Paypal is the largest group, with 50 payments.] So I thought I'd describe a bit about how we have worked with procurement. We have divided the procurement of seven steps.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Police have sorted the information about Breivik procurement through seven steps: - investigation - inquiry - booking - payment - reception - use - The seizure of these steps, the police have attempted to identify gaps and ensure that they have all the

information. Seip right shows how the police have worked with a power-point presentation. Breivik sit quietly and follow the Seip explanation. He does not react visibly to the evidence she presents. On either side are the defenders Breivik Vibeke Hein Bæra and Geir Lippestad, both of which included Seip carefully.

15:45:

Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- Lots of detail, and to identify missing and conflicting information, we have divided it into here. We have a survey, contacting, booking, payment, receipt, use and seizures. Each of these steps contributes to the information needed to identify objects which in turn enables us to find information about how an object is obtained. There has been a great challenge to figure out. We have worked with it and believe we have good control over this. There has been varied information base. If you go to the store and buy an item in cash, there is a limit to how much information you provide, but do it on the internet, there are lots of tracks. We have both in this case. I'll show an example, the purchase of aluminum powder from Poland, used in the bomb, I jump straight to step two - inquiry. I can say about step one, examination, that we have very little information, data logger, we have not managed to secure a long time ago. Inquiry, however, where we have something. On this particular acquisition we have said that the inquiry took place 17.11.2010. We do this based on a mail [email to show picture]. Next step, ordering 26.11, the same mail from both. Payment, 22/12/10, from Breivik Geofarm, we can see here it is transmitted in excess of 15,000 dollars. Furthermore, receipt of these things, 11/03/11. We have probably a mail. The top sentence is the end of an e-mail to Breivik where it is mentioned a number, the second part is a response from Breivik 10 March, which states that a person from a Swedish forwarder, Schenker, called today. We go into our database and see if we kjnenn the phone number listed and the date. We find the Swedish phone number for Schenker in the database and found two phone calls from numbers that defendant disposal and receiver in Sweden.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Seip undergoes how Breivik ordered a chemical and how it was confirmed ordered a recall ballot. Furthermore, police used GPS tracking to show how it was transported to Vålstua farm, as well as evidence that it was used in the bomb and later seized. Police have not identified all of the purchases of the effects of Breivik's own compositions uniform, but know that they can be purchased online. All uniform effects Breivik was wearing when he was arrested on Utøya, was acquired in March 2010, according to police.

15:51:

Witness Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- We also have a pick-up note, one of several, dated 11.3 2011 signed that Anders Breivik. It seems we are from Schenker. So the question is: Is that Anders, who has taken this package? We go into the database and retrieves the GPS position. This map shows an excerpt from Oslo and Karlstad here, at 14.50. This GPS is found in the defendant's car. We see the return of two tolls, and ends up in Oslo West. This substantiates that Breivik collected the goods and signed the receipt. When it comes to use. This is a picture from the mixing room at Valstua farm. We see a lot Rema 1000 bags along the wall. The picture is probably taken by the defendant himself. When we get to spring, somewhat later, we seized 12 bags Rema 1000 in the same place. The content here is 32 kg aluminiumspulver. Then we found information about the steps 2-6 on the object aluminiumspulver. In this way we have worked with each purchase. I'm not going to go through this in detail. Then I thought to go through a group summary of the four categories I mentioned earlier. Let's start with the uniform. [The image of Breivik wearing his gala uniform appears on the screen in court.] [Breivik chuckles and drink some water.] 11 purchases from 11 vendors from 5 countries. All purchases related to the defendant through Pay Pal, Ebay and so on. We have a couple of unidentified purchases. The police are also aware that Breivik have uniform effects related to the Masonic Lodge. They are not among the details that are presented here.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Several journalists leave the hall during Seip explanation. There has been enough of a long day in court for many, and the air in room 250 has been poor.

15:56:

Witness Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- It is also set up a bar chart of when procurement has taken place. First we see a column from September 2009. When it was first purchased a medal on 19 september. Three days after the defendant went up to 3rd degree in the Masonic lodge. It also bought a ring and a necklace a few days after that. We have not found any more purchases until February 2010. In February and March are the registered four purchases, and in May it is a purchase. The uniform effects of his arrest was purchased in March 2010. The next group we have called the equipment. It has been challenging, there have been many articles and they are of

unknown nature to us. There are many small things that are put together into one thing. We had to pick it apart to understand that there have been various purchases. There is equipment that defendant was wearing when he was arrested, in addition to equipment in the car on Utvika and Vålstua. There are pieces of armor that defendant said he was trying to make. - Equipment, we have found, purchased from April 2010 to March 2011. It is found 29 sellers from 8 countries. In Norway, there are five purchases from five vendors, and four of them are from the account. In other countries there are 32 purchases from 24 vendors. When it comes to ordering from this group, there is a lot through eBay and the Internet, and there is also much from Finn and telephone. There have been several shipments of address with the courier, but we have also found information on the collection of post office. And fitting, as I said, it is done on both defendants on Utøya on Utvika and Vålstua farm.

Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- When it comes to what period it was made purchases here, I said it was from April 2010 to March 2011. What we see from the bar graph is that most occurred in June 2010. I move on to the group "weapons, weapons parts and ammunition" and this picture does at least nine different parts procurement, aiming bayonet, and so on [show picture of Breivik's rifle]. We also have information that the defendant has been a member of a shooting club and it appears that the activity was in the autumn of 2005-2006.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Mostly Grounded and Odd Ivar Green talks briefly together while Seip explains himself. They both have Macs with car park in front of him.

15:58:

Witness Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- Further he paid dues again in June 2010. After June 2010 it recorded 16 shooting trainings that Breivik have attended. Then there is the period during which these purchases are made. From May 2010 to June 2011, I comment on the purchase of the shotgun in particular. [Judge Arntzen: - We have seen a face mask episode. Is there something you've gone into?] No, but we can soon find out. [The prosecutor Holden: - Were we talking about 16 or 18 shooting sessions?] 18 total. 16 with pistol and two rifles. When I come to the shotgun in 2003. Then, I secured a mail from a friend of Breivik. [Produces a comment about the shotgun Breivik to buy.] Breivik took a diploma in April 2003.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Seip explains that Breivik bought four guns, 13 guns parts and 5 rounds of ammunition + 1 orders which he bought ammunition with a weapon. Both the weapons and ammunition were bought by Norwegian retailers, while weapons parts were purchased online. Breivik brought more than 1,000 cartridges Utøya.

16:03:

Witness Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- So, within this group, we identified 22 purchases from 14 vendors in four countries. I will say little about these purchases. We are familiar with the purchase of four guns. All four were purchased from Norwegian retailers and the defendant had weapons permit in his own name. One of the weapons was a rifle that was sold by the defendant in January 2011. In July 2011, we recorded that he had three weapons: a rifle, a shotgun and a pistol. We have registered 13 purchase of weapons parts and they are made on the internet. They are purchased using bank account and Paypal account. In the case of ammunition, we have isolated five related purchase of ammunition and one where it was purchased weapons and ammunition together. They are made by the Norwegian foandlere. There are two purchases we do not have evidence beyond the testimony with the dealer. On Utøya are also found no ammunition that is similar to that used in rifle training. - I have also set up the famous purchase of weapons and ammunition, and here we see that it extends over one year, from May 2010 to June 2011 . Here we have assumed the timing of when the applications for firearms licenses have been sent, not when the purchase is completed. That is not when guns are purchased, but when preparations began. In July, there is a bought a rifle, it was later sold. In September it bought another rifle, it is the one that was found on Utøya. Furthermore, we have an application to the Glock, it was submitted in January 2011. Otherwise, the main weight of the ammunition purchased in the spring of 2011.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Police found less than 60 ml of nicotine on Vålstua farm, but are not sure where it comes from. Possibly it may be linked to a transaction and a shipment from China in 2010, but this is not documented, according to Seip. Breivik wrote in his manifesto that he considered using the nicotine in the balls he should spend on Utøya, but he did not.

Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- In total it is registered in more than 1500 pieces of ammunition, various types.

I've also included some information about what we know about the purchase of nicotine. We have not been verified purchase, we have found in less than 60 milliliters of nicotine on Vålstua, but do not know where it komer from. We have a transaction to China not knuytter to other objects, and a shipment in 2010, which is also related to other acquisitions. But we can not say for sure. So is the last group that I come in on, that's what we have called the bomb. Here we have identified acquisitions in the period 2010 to 2011. 36 sellers from different countries, 14 from other countries, 22 from Norway. It identified 11 purchases of chemicals, which were used to create the bomb. All of these purchases of chemicals, linked to Breivik through payment.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

The production of the bomb, the police have identified 43 purchases from 26 vendors in 5 countries. They also have several unidentified shopping for ingredients that are seized by the Vålstua farm. While Seip explains, scroll Breivik the stack of papers she handed out before she began. He just smiles when she talks about how to obtain many of bomb ingredients.

16:08:

Witness Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- All tied to him. The rest of the objects in this group are either betandsdeler the bomb parts or production in the broad sense. Here we have recorded 32 purchases. It is common objects, blenders, scales, office supplies. We also have a lot of unidentified purchases. We have no knowledge of how Asperin / Aspirin was obtained. Breivik testified that he bought this at a pharmacy. [Shows a picture of the seizure.] Furthermore, other unidentified purchases. We have some receipts in such a condition that we do not see the date. Here are the purchases from September 2010 to June 2011. It seems that chemicals were obtained in autumn 2010, with the exception of [other materials], which was acquired after the defendant had access to the farm. Otherwise, components and manufacturing equipment spread over this period. In connection with the bomb, I would say little about the farm and vehicles.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Police have found that Breivik had contact with several Swedish municipalities summer of 2010 in search of a farm where he could move into. When this did not work, he applied for a farm on the Internet and signed a lease on Vålstua farm. Police believe he moved onto the farm 4 May 2011. Seip has now finished his statement and it will open for questions. Lippestad begins. After Lippestad get a

clarification on an e-mail that was sent on a field event, take Vibeke Hein carry over. Meanwhile, talks Breivik and Lippestad cards together. Also Torgeir Husby and Synne Sørheim discuss low-key.

16:13:

Witness Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- When it comes to the farm, it is found on the defendant's mailer mail account that shows contacts with Swedish municipalities in 2010. There, he requested opportunity to rent a place to stay. There was nothing as far as we can see, and when it was Vålstua farm. What we know is that in March 2011 the owner put the place out for rent on a website, and a few days later, the defendant that he sought after. Contacts were made and the contract was signed on 6 april. The lease commenced on 1 May and we know that he is physically moved to the farm 4 of May. For vehicles we know Fiat Doblo'en. It's a rental car from Avis, hired the defendant's name. It was found to developers. Then there are the other car Volkswagen Crafter, hired the defendant's name and it contained the bomb in its ministries. It also bought a mini bike that was purchased in March, it is not found, and the explanation of the accused have been in the craft does in its ministries. - That's what I thought to account for. [Holden: - When do I have to say thank you, I have no further questions and with this event with the field it is a key document they do not have access to, but there are indications that the field meeting was held on 22 april. And when it comes to it, the defendant explained that the face mask, it missed him.] [Judge Arntzen: - Was sued for firing exercise?] [Holden - I think I should be careful to say exactly what this is.] There may be one of the 16 that I mentioned, because I have not quite track.

Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- [Lippestad: - Only a very short question, to what you mentioned about the shotgun in 2003, the mail you referred to. Can not you read again what was there?] I took it from the swing, I was not here, I think it is from NNS mail account. [Lippestad: - You mention a name which, you know who it is?] I have the understanding that it is Breivik. I understand this is taken from the NNS mail account to NN. [Vibeke Hein Bæra: - Have you made you some thoughts and consideration about the relevance of these purchases against what we now know that they used to?] Are you thinking about some special items? [Hein Bæra: - I think of the total. We have reviewed 112 gjenstnader. And then down the same street, you have done you some thoughts on what it said on the planning ability and implementation capacity?]

16:15:

Witness Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- I think I'll be careful not to say anything about the functional or not. It's beyond my expertise. But most are bought on the internet. I have not told the details of what kind of items that are purchased, but within the group equipment, there are many objects that do not lead away (...) Among other things, the armor, which is described in the manifesto, we find once again part of the farm. [Defendant Hein Bæra: - But other things like weapons, this is the thing that is easy to obtain?] I do not know how the defendants have come into contact with the seller. But if you have purchased the right things, to do what he had intended to do, I do not know.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Bæra want to know what the many purchases made Breivik can say about his abilities. The first two experts who assessed Breivik to be unaccountable, vurdete him to have a very low and barely functional istadn to carry out everyday tasks. - I will be careful not to say anything about disability, but much of what is bought is bought on the internet. It is the touch of a button, said Seip. She also points out that much of the equipment they found on Vålstua farmers were not used in the attacks, and that she did not know what that was purchased for. She would not comment this any further. Breivik sent an e-mail at Swedish to several Swedish municipalities, where he said he would write a book about the stock strategies and that he would hire a farm near the woods where it was well insulated. In the email add rhan the inquiry in Swedish, in its own name. It was Judge Arne Lyng who asked to know more about what the communication with the Swedish municipalities went in.

16:22:

Witness Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- [prosecutor Holden: - Judge if allowed, I can refer the interview with the doctor to Breivik, who can shed light on the timing of face mask] [Judge Anrtzen: - The date specified in the experts' explanations, but If Breivik agree it] [Defense Lippestad: - It is right and he has not consented to it] [Lawyer Mette Yvonne Larsen: - If we go back to the defender Bæra ask you about, this is it with the point that the bomb and chemicals to do. Is there any purchases that someone has noticed. Is it routine purchases of these chemicals?] There are mostly items that are easy accessible. [Seip explains what these are] [Lawyer Yvonne Mette Larsen: - It has been an issue if he did buy some should have discovered] Need a

notification? [Lawyer Yvonne Mette Larsen: - Yes] It was the purchase of the cord from normal dealer in Poland. When did the Customs notification. [Lawyer Yvonne Mette Larsen: - Can you briefly say something about what happened to the notification from the customs?] It went on to PST. Further than that I do not know. [Lawyer Mette Yvonne Larsen - Is it only the purchase of exposures that are in that category] Yes, it is the purchase of 121 million. - [Judge Arntzen: - Have the experts any questions? Some of the members? [Judge Lyng: - You were so far back in touch with someone in Sweden. Do you know the contents of the e-mail?] Where he describes who he is and that he will spend the next two years to write a book about the stock strategies, and asks for help finding a place to stay when in small farms. It says among other things: "Do not be furnished, do not have electricity."

Anette Seip, police superintendent NCIS:

- This is an example of such a mail. Most people we have are answers by e-mail, so we do not know what all has been, but we assume that it is sent, etc., where the answers come in a few days. I can print it if you want to have it as well. [Lay judge Arne Lyng: - This rifle was bought and sold again, you can say anything more about this sale?] It was sold via Finn.no and lay out on the Find in a few months before it was sold to a private person. A bought the rifle and another bought ammunition.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

Breivik, several comments also Seip explanation. He responds that she has emphasized the purchase of uniforms as much as the purchase of weapons, bomb ingredients and equipment. He thinks the uniform is of little importance. He will also stress that the gun he bought in 2003 was purchased to create a "track record" so that it would be easier for him to buy weapons later.

16:24:

Behring Anders Breivik:

- The purchase is made uniform as it was very important. The uniform is absolutely not important, maybe a hundredth of it all. Shotgun that was purchased in 2003 was purchased to create a track record for future weapons purchases. Shotgun that was purchased was not a hunting shotgun, but a police or military shotgun for six cartridges. The purpose was later use, fighting. It's not that my friends bought shotguns simultaneously. Only two of five bought then, the other bought at a later date. Also purchase in 2005 was later weapons purchases. The event was the 22nd Field april 2011 and it was, in other words, only a few days before I would move up to Rena. Usually only once a year, so it was the only opportunity I had to train with Glock. The 5-10 minutes I used the face mask. [Judge Arntzen: - Do you have

anything against that Holden read from the interrogation of GP?] It's all right there.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

District Court Judge Arntzen will clarify what happened when Breivik used masks in there with her mother because he would not get sick before a field meeting in Oslo gun club. Breivik believes this was a few days before the event, 22 April, while in the expert report Husby and Sørheim is that there were 13 and 15 April. Sørheim draws on the shoulder when she hears this, and Holden says it should be checked.

16:25:

Prosecutor Svein Holden:

- "The GP said that she spoke with the accused 11 april, and he had asked to antibiotics due to sinus infection. He respekt on antibiotics when he had described the symptoms and it seemed like it did. He thought he had been infected by his mother and he thought it was strange because he had a face mask all the time when he went home. " [Mette Yvonne Larsen: - It is important to emphasize that what is in Husby and Sørheim report that there is the 13th While it is april 15 april has been discharged antibiotics]

16:26:

Behring Anders Breivik:

- Can I just comment on that card? I called the doctor, I asked whether it was appropriate to use a face mask if you wanted to avoid getting sick. And when I got the answer that I could use it, but that if it was viral, it was not very effective, but if it were bacteria that could work. So it was that conversation.

Comment from Eva VG-Therese Grøttum:

We're back with new updates from the clock 09 in the morning.

16:26:

Judge Wenche Elizabeth Arntzen:
